

EXHIBIT 2: FORM 340, SECTION II, QUESTION 4(b)

The purpose of this exhibit is to demonstrate the Peace and Justice Network of San Joaquin County's educational objective and demonstrate that the proposed radio station will be used for the advancement of an educational program under 73.503(a) of the Rules. The rules describe that noncommercial licenses are not limited to classroom instruction, but may "transmit educational, cultural, and entertainment program to the general public," (Section 73.503(b)) in the advancement of a radio program. The following describes this:

EDUCATIONAL NATURE AND PROGRAM

Peace and Justice Network of San Joaquin County is an established 20-year-old non-profit educational organization under section 501(c)(3) of the IRS code. Within its bylaws it states that the "the purpose is to educate individuals and groups in the community about nonviolent resolution of conflict and the realization of peace, justice, and planetary survival."

The Standing Rules of the Network further state in PURPOSES and FUNCTIONS:

b. To coordinate and disseminate information with regard to events and activities involving such issues.

c. To provide mutual support among groups and individuals who are concerned with such issues.

d. To encourage communication on these issues among those of varying points of view.

2. FUNCTIONS

a. Facilitate communication, cooperation and information exchange between member groups

b. Produce newsletter, Connections

c. Maintain resource center

d. Maintain Peace & Justice Network coordinating office

e. Organize speakers' bureau

f. Fundraising

g. Sponsor guest speakers

h. Maintain a presence in the community

i. Meet the needs of the membership

j. Provide tax-free status for donations

The Network's objective is well in-line with the qualification of being considered an educational nonprofit.

PAST EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The Peace and Justice Network of San Joaquin County (P.J.N S.J.C) in the last 20 years has provided many educational events and programs. For example:

- CONNECTIONS, San Joaquin County's Alternative Newspaper produced and distributed freely providing educational articles on a wide variety of issues
- Presentation of films and/or speakers on a wide variety of topics concerning local, national and international events including nuclear development, current events, election campaigns and governmental proceedings, environmental issues, and social justice topics including health care, immigration, youth and poverty, education, and gender orientation.
- Annual participation in Earthday, educating the public on environmental responsibility a
- and the Mayor's Youth Fair educating youth regarding jobs and careers in stewardship of the city, state and global community.
- Sponsor of the Peaceful Holiday Fair encouraging alternatives to consumerism and violent or hurtful toys.
- Talking it Through and The Reality Show, local television shows providing a forum for a wide range of community members and organizations to discuss current local and international issues
- The PJN SJC Center provides educational media promoting art, diversity, science, and education

A proposed radio channel for Stockton, California would provide broader public outreach and would widen the educational forum for speakers, music, and discussion related to the goals and mission of the PJN SJC. As an educational tool a local noncommercial educational broadcast would reach a larger audience, draw in a more diverse group which would provide a broader curriculum for education. A radio station would greatly enrich the lives of the people in the listening area.


PROPOSED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

Peace and Justice Network of San Joaquin County intends to utilize the proposed facility to extend its educational mission to the airwaves by carrying:

- Public affairs programming dealing with art, environment, current affairs, diversity, and media education.
- Political news and information and opinion
- Local cultural events
- News/views of local high school and college youth
- Interviews and talk shows including a wide range of views
- Live presentations of community speakers and events
- A diversity of musical programming
- Debates, independent news, and issues of concern to the community.

The radio program will basically expend its current program to fully actualize its original intent prescribed in its mission.
