**COMMENTS OF LIBCO, INC.  
 IN SUPPORT OF NOE CORP. LLC APPLICATION**

By these comments, LibCo, Inc. ("LibCo"), licensee of KPLC(TV), NTSC Channel 7, Lake Charles, Louisiana, and permittee of KPLC-DT, DTV Channel 8, hereby supports grant of the above-referenced construction permit application (the "Application") for minor modification of the construction permit for KNOE-DT, DTV Channel 7, Monroe, Louisiana (the "Station"), filed by Noe Corp. LLC ("Noe").<sup>1</sup> The Application proposes to increase the Station's effective radiated power from 5 kW to 17 kW, increasing the Station's service area.<sup>2</sup>

Grant of the Application would help implement the DTV interference agreement (the "Agreement") dated May 1, 2000, between Noe and Cosmos Broadcasting Corporation, which wholly owns LibCo. Pursuant to the Agreement, each party's DTV facilities, KNOE-DT or KPLC-DT, may cause interference to the other party's analog operations, KNOE-TV or KPLC(TV), in excess of the *de minimis* level during the DTV transition to facilitate service by each station's DTV



facility, in accordance with Section 73.623(f) of the Commission's Rules and policy statements adopted in MM Docket Number 87-268, which encourage the adoption of negotiated interference agreements to facilitate the implementation of DTV services. According to the Application, the proposed facilities would cause interference to co-channel KPLC-TV in excess of the 2% *de minimis* level.<sup>3</sup> As indicated in the Application, the temporary increase in received analog interference to KPLC-TV will serve the public interest by affording an opportunity for increased DTV service. As such, grant of the Application will help implement the Agreement and serve the public interest.

Accordingly, the Media Bureau should grant the Application forthwith.


