Domestic Church Media Foundation is a non-stock, non-profit corporation chartered in Pennsylvania with tax-exempt status granted by the Internal Revenue Service pursuant to 26 U.S.C. §501(c)(3). Domestic Church Media Foundation hereby certifies that it intends to operate station WDDM(FM) in accordance with Section 73.507 of the FCC's Rules.

Educational Mission of DCMF

Domestic Church Media Foundation (DCMF) is a Pennsylvania non-profit corporation which was formed for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes. As noted above, it has been granted tax exempt status pursuant to 26 U.S.C §501(c)(3) by the Internal Revenue Service.

In practice, DCMF's educational mission will involve the following:

- a. Providing regular educational programming designed to teach the Bible and the Catechism of the Roman Catholic Church in a manner which can be utilized by local Roman Catholic schools as well as by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine educational programs administered by local Roman Catholic parish churches.
- b. Working with Roman Catholic educational and contemplative institutions, including but not limited to Franciscan University of Steubenville at Steubenville, Ohio and Our Lady of the Angels Monastery in Cullman County, Alabama, for the presentation of quality educational programming.
- c. Providing programming which can be used to train laymen for an active and effectual role in Roman Catholic parish life, such as lector, catechism teacher, etc.

Programming In Furtherance of DCMF's Educational Mission

Programming to be aired by DCMF over WDDM(FM) will come from a number of sources, including but not limited to, the radio service of Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN). EWTN is headquartered on the former site of Our Lady of the Angels Monastery in Irondale, Alabama, which was founded and operated by the Roman Catholic order of nuns known as Poor Clares of Perpetual Adoration¹. The founder of Our Lady of the Angels is Mother M. Angelica, P.C.P.A. The main purpose of EWTN has been described by Mother Angelica as "catechesis": that is, the teaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the Catechism of the Roman Catholic Church.

EWTN's programming is commercial-free, and there is no paid programming which is aired on EWTN. Such programming would be broadcast over WDDM(FM) in a commercial-free manner. Programming consists of the following basic types: (1) rebroadcasts of "Interactive" programs which involve a host or moderator and call-in questions from listeners; (2) recorded programs presented by eminent Roman Catholic professors and scholars dealing with various topics of the Gospels and Roman Catholic catechism (categories 1 and 2 occupy a majority of the broadcast day); (3) Roman Catholic Masses, the Holy Rosary and various recitations of various devotionals; and (4) news programs known by the title "Catholic World Today" and "The World Over".

¹EWTN's radio service originates from the studios of shortwave radio station WEWN, located south of Leeds, Alabama. The monastery and nuns' residence has been relocated to a site east of Hanceville, Alabama.

With respect to the Interactive programs that would be carried over WLYV, here are some brief descriptions of examples of such programs which have been offered in recent years by EWTN to local stations:

Join us for this live, family-oriented program hosted by Steve Wood, president of the Family Life Center and St. Joseph's Covenant Keepers. Enjoy expert guests, listeners' calls, and e-mails.

DCMF intends to work with the Catholic Diocese of Metuchen (in which the station is located) and local Roman Catholic parishes, catechism programs and organizations to assist their educational efforts with respect to teaching of the

Catholic religion. In short, DCMF intends to develop WDDM(FM) as a valuable educational resource which will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity.
