Dear Counsel:

This is with respect to the Petition for Reconsideration filed by Entravision Holdings, LLC (“Entravision”) on October 12, 2012, asking the Media Bureau to reconsider its action granting a Petition for Reconsideration and Petition to Deny filed by Journal Broadcast Corporation (“Journal”) against the above captioned applications.<sup>1</sup> On March 18, 2014, Entravision was granted a construction permit for a digital companion channel on channel 41.<sup>2</sup> Subsequently, a low power license to cover for Station KVER-LD was granted on July 29, 2014.<sup>3</sup> As of the date of this letter Entravision has pending before the Commission application to convert the Class A status of KVER-CA to KVER-LD.<sup>4</sup>

Accordingly, the Petition for Reconsideration filed by Entravision Holdings, LLC IS **DISMISSED AS MOOT**.
