

## ELIGIBLE ENTITY NARRATIVE

The instant application was filed pursuant to the new procedures established in the FCC's diversity proceeding to transfer expiring construction permits to an "eligible entity."<sup>1</sup>

Pursuant to the new rules promulgated by the *Diversity R&O*, "an eligible entity that acquires an issued and outstanding construction permit for [a non commercial educational FM station]...shall have the time remaining on the construction permit or eighteen months from the consummation of the assignment or transfer of control, whichever is longer, within which to complete construction and file an application for license."<sup>2</sup>

The permit being assigned in the instant application from Philipsburg School District 1 to Hi-Line Radio Fellowship, Inc. ("Hi-Line") expires on May 12, 2011. Thus, upon consummation of the transaction contemplated by the instant application, Hi-Line requires an additional 18-months to construct the facilities being assigned. Hi-Line hereby pledges to complete construction of the station within the 18-month period.

Hi-Line is an "eligible entity" as defined by Section 73.3598(a) of the FCC's Rules.<sup>3</sup> Hi-Line qualifies as a small business entity under Small Business Administration's (SBA) revenue standards for the radio broadcasting industry, which is no more than \$6.5 million in annual receipts.<sup>3</sup> Hi-Line hereby certifies that, collectively, the annual receipts of Hi-Line and its principals are less than \$6.5 million.
