Dear Licensee:

This is with respect to the petition for reconsideration (Petition) filed May 20, 2016, by the Trustees of J.B. Callaham Revocable Trust (Licensee), the licensee of station K28DJ-D, Broken Bow, Oklahoma (Station), seeking reinstatement of the Station's license. For the reasons below we grant the Petition and pending license renewal application and reinstate the Station's license and call-sign.

On April 19, 2016, the Video Division cancelled the Station's license and deleted its call sign for failure to file the required renewal application within the required time period as specified by section 73.3539 (a) of the Commission's Rules. Based on the facts and circumstances stated in the Petition, we find that reinstatement of the license is appropriate and would be in furtherance of the public interest. We note that the public interest benefits in support of reinstatement do not excuse the Licensee's unawareness of its requirement to renew the Station's license within the required period of time. While we decline to take any further action against the Licensee at this time, we remind the Licensee of its obligation to comply and become familiar with all relevant statues and Commission rules.¹

Accordingly, the Petition for Reconsideration and the license renewal, File No BRDTL-20160524ABC, filed by the Trustees of J.B. Callaham Revocable Trust **ARE GRANTED** and the license, File No BLDTL-20120314ABZ, and call sign for Station K28DJ-D, Broken Bow, Oklahoma, **ARE REINSTATED**.
