

NATURE AND EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES OF APPLICANT

Non-Profit and Educational Nature

It is the intent of the applicant to operate the proposed station in a manner consistent of Subpart G of Part 73 of the Commission's Rules.

The applicant, a non-profit educational organization, is a Florida non-profit corporation which was incorporated on August 14, 2006. Our Articles of Incorporation demonstrating that we have been recognized by the State of Florida as a non-profit entity are attached as a separate PDF under Exhibit 2. Its headquarters is located at 3308 East 15th Street, Panama City, Florida, at approximate NAD27 coordinates 30° 10' 31" north latitude and 85° 36' 47" west longitude. The proposed transmitter and antenna location for our proposed low power FM station would be on St. Dominic's property, 0.052 mile from our headquarters, at NAD27 coordinates 30° 10' 32.5" north latitude and 85° 36' 49.6" west longitude.

As we understand Section 73.853 of the FCC's Rules and Regulations, since the applicant's headquarters have been located within 20 miles of the proposed antenna location for more than the past two years, the applicant qualifies as an "established local applicant" for purposes of the so-called point system.

The purposes of St. Dominic's Media Production Center, Inc. as stated in its articles of incorporation are:

Section 1. Said Corporation is organized for charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code; providing or arranging for production of educational and religious based media programs and for the purpose of accomplishing the same; to receive and maintain real or personal property, or both; and, subject to the restrictions and limitations hereinafter set forth, to use and apply the whole or any part of the income therefrom and the principal thereof for charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational purposes either directly or by contributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and Regulations issued pursuant thereto as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.

In *Columbia Bible College Broadcasting Co.*, 6 FCC Rcd 516 (1991), at paragraphs 9 and 10, the Commission stated that religiously-oriented applicants can meet the eligibility standards set forth in Section 73.503 of the Commission's Rules, where the applicant (1) proposes an overall educational program and (2) its proposed programming furthers its educational objectives. As can be seen by this Exhibit, the applicant has been in existence for over seven years at the same location, and its purposes evidence an overall educational program.

Furtherance of Educational Objectives

The applicant is eligible pursuant to Section 73.503 to be a non-commercial licensee of the station covered by this application, because the applicant proposes programming which constitutes an overall educational program and the programming

further the organization's educational objectives. In this case, the applicant intends to broadcast programs to further its educational purposes as outlined above.

Our educational nature is evidenced by the large amount of material we have already produced. This includes over 70 program segments including topics on history and philosophy, and topics of a spiritual nature like prayer and meditation, suffering and forgiveness, dealing with death and illness, and practicing faith and teaching values. This material is of a non-commercial nature and directed at helping people live better and more enjoyable lives. Contributors and interview guests include educators, psychologists and physicians, researchers, pastors and deacons, local legislators and school officials, and parents.

Although the exact titles and subject matter of the programs will be determined at the time the proposed station is constructed and ready for operation, we can state that the selection of all programs to air on our proposed station will be consistent with and guided by the foregoing corporate purposes as stated in our Articles of Incorporation.

The proposed low power FM station will also work with local churches, parishes, religious education programs and organizations to assist their educational efforts with respect to teaching time tested values and moral principles.

In sum, it is our objective to use the proposed radio station to provide a valuable educational resource for the residents of the Panama City area that we propose to serve.
