TECHNICAL STATEMENT

This Technical Statement was prepared on behalf of Sea-Comm, Inc. ("Sea-Comm"), licensee of radio station WNTB (formerly WBNE), Channel 229A, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina. Sea-Comm holds an outstanding permit to make minor changes in the facilities of WNTB (BMPH-20060921AAY), which also authorized a change in community of license to Topsail Beach, North Carolina. Sea-Comm herein submits an application for a license to cover the permit. A calculation of the transmitter power output of the WNTB transmitter is attached as Exhibit A.

There are four conditions/restrictions on the WNTB permit. The first condition states that Channel 229C3 at Topsail Beach, North Carolina has been downgraded to Channel 229A, effective with the grant of the permit. Sea-Comm acknowledges this channel change. The second condition notes that the WNTB permit was issued pursuant to §73.215 of the rules. Sea-Comm acknowledges this condition. The third condition states that Sea-Comm will reduce the power of WNTB or cease operation, as needed, to insure that persons with access to the tower will not be exposed to radio frequency radiation levels in excess of the Commission's guidelines. Sea-Comm will comply with this requirement.

The final condition notes that commencement of program test for WNTB shall commence simultaneously with program tests for station WBNE (formerly WBNU) at Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina. Further, that station WWTB, Topsail Beach, North Carolina must suspend operations unless it has commenced operation with its permitted facilities at Swansboro, North Carolina, or the station's license has been assigned to Educational Media Foundation ("EMF"). The Commission has granted WWTB authority to be silent pursuant to BLSTA-20070208AAE, as the station has yet to be constructed in Swansboro, nor has the pending assignment to EMF been consummated.

Based on the foregoing, it is believed that WNTB is operating in compliance with the Commission's rules.
