The Jean Arnold Group Foundation was established to educate the public about Women's Health Issues. The foundation has held numerous events, organized local women with think tanks, small gatherings and other efforts. Education of other women as well as the public at large about Women's Health Issues is a central factor in our organizing intention.

A Radio Station would augment these outreach efforts as well as crystalize education efforts surrounding other areas of community health as well. School participation, civic participation and welcoming the arts community would be examples of using radio to increase our outreach and education efforts.

Mission Statement:

As a project of the Jean Arnold Group Foundation, The Napa Radio Project will be a community based radio broadcast outlet for Napa, Carneros, and the town of Sonoma with a focus on experiential learning and volunteer opportunities for people of all ages, especially young people.

We will be an all-ages volunteer fueled terrestrial and online radio station based in or Napa Valley. Programming will be based around a broad representation of music genres and will include specialty shows, local programming and education programming. In order to further our informational reach pertaining to cancer and women's health we will write and produce Public Service Announcements that feature discourse on these topics as we work with like minded groups to promote awareness and knowledge.

In creating a participatory radio station we plan to offer the following:

- * Live and Studio recording
- * Leadership training
- * Local Event promotion and production training.
- * Social Media outreach
- * Music review and critical thinking around the history of music
