

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATIONOFTRI-SHIELDARTICLE I

The name of this corporation is TRI-SHIELD.

ARTICLE II

This corporation is a religious corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Religious Corporation Law exclusively for religious purposes. A further description of the corporation's purposes includes, but is not limited to, the following: the expansion of the ministry of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ by utilizing all current and future media opportunities such as television, radio, internet, print, audio/visual and cyber avenues; to educate, inform and instruct in accordance with the biblical mandate as set forth in the Bible; and to participate in domestic as well as international efforts in order to bring counseling, biblical guidance and relief to those in need.

ARTICLE III

The name and address in the State of California of this corporation's initial agent for service of process is: Jack Hibbs, 4201 Eucalyptus Avenue, Chino, California 91710.

ARTICLE IV

A. This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

B. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and this corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office.


ARTICLE V

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal

Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE VI

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to religious purposes, and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member thereof, or to the benefit of any private person. Upon the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).
