President's Message

When we reflect on the meaning of the Fourth of July, we usually review the benefits, the privileges, the freedoms, the rights that we have as our American birthright, but rarely do we reflect on the obligations that come with those unique advantages. We might think we are obliged to be good citizens, but what does that mean? The word "citizen" leads me to memories of my earliest formal education, and the person who most likely had the strongest hand in shaping my attitude about citizenship, although I never met him.



"Citizen" is the first word that I can remember learning to spell (after my names). I was in "primer," a grade for 5-year-olds that was more academic than, say, Cynwyd School's kindergarten. We were in a one-room schoolhouse in which there was no plumbing. For heat we relied on the teacher's arriving early enough each day to stoke the coal fire in the cast-iron stove that stood in the middle of the room. I don't recall the context in which "citizen" was presented, but since older children were being taught in the same room, I probably overheard it in one of their lessons.

That school was known as "Green Bottom," named for the small, lush meadow on which it stood, mimicking the one across the dusty, rutted dirt road, up a "holler" on Two Mile Creek in Kanawha County, West Virginia, seven miles north of Charleston. When my

Independence Day Celebration Off with a Bang on July 4th

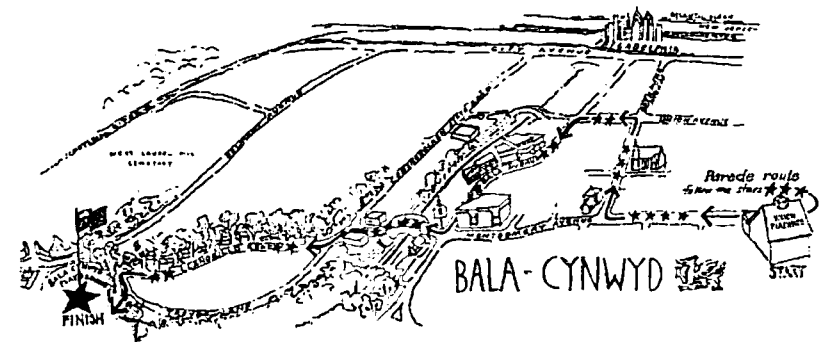

Commissioner's Corner

Although you will be reading this in anticipation of the July 4th holiday weekend, NCBC President, Phyllis Kelley, asked me to write a column sharing with our readers an overview of serving as a Commissioner in Lower Merion Township. The two topics – Independence Day and serving on the township's Board of Commissioners – seem to me to share an idea, so writing this column at this time is appropriate. Our founding fathers gave us a representative form of government, and it is that form that we honor in our township. "Commissioner" is a role in which I have proudly served, representing Bala Cynwyd for more than 25 years. I can say bluntly, however, that the last two years of my tenure have been among the most challenging.

During this time, in which I served as President and now Vice-President of the Board of Commissioners, we have held many public hearings and meetings on issues designed to bring the Township into the 21st Century in terms of our residential and economic vitality. Unfortunately, some residents of the Township view these efforts — and the hard work of the Board of Commissioners — as attempts to destroy either the past or the status quo.

Our medical institutions provide good examples of this attitude. When Lankenau Hospital demonstrated its need to expand to be ready to serve our constituents in future years, the immediate response by some of the Hospital's neighbors was to vehemently oppose such a request by asking us not to change anything and especially not to allow the creation of a second access to the Hospital. Similarly, when Bryn Mawr Hospital demonstrated a need to

father and his sisters attended that little school, their father, Shelley Faber, was the one stoking the fire and giving the lessons. It was Shelley from whom I learned the meaning of citizenship, even though he was killed in an accident several years before I was born.

Since my family lived on the Faber homeplace, I grew up with all the lore on "the creek." Central to that lore were tales of "Mr. Faber," the schoolteacher who, by all accounts, was a central figure in the goings-on in the community. From an early age I saw my grandfather, the phantom presence, as the embodiment of "good citizenship." He persuaded gawky young boys to stay in school; he convinced doubtful, illiterate parents of the need to educate their children; and he delivered completed ballots into town to be counted after each election, on his mule or his horse in the early days, and (in the '30's) in his new Ford. He saw that the poorest children in the neighborhood had some candy and a toy at Christmas, and he routinely took produce from his garden to the widow who had seven young mouths to feed. His final act on behalf of the community was to petition, successfully, the US Postmaster General for Rural Free Delivery on Two Mile Creek. Shelley's petition was dated March 1936, the month and year in which he died. RFD Rt. 6, Charleston, is active to this day.

The kinds of good citizenship exercised by my grandfather in the foothills of the Appalachians seem quaint today. In Bala Cynwyd we have many neighbors who fulfill the basics of good 21st century citizenship — picking up papers that blow onto their properties, keeping lawns clipped in summer and sidewalks shoveled in winter, and taking in trash receptacles shortly after they are emptied.

Dealing with broader community issues, though, requires more than individual acts of good citizenship these days, and that is where The Neighborhood Club comes in. The twenty members of our Board volunteer both time and talents, but the projects that we support cost money. Our Independence Day celebration, for example, is supported by generous contributions from merchants and neighbors. We always come up thousands of dollars short, though, and the deficit is made up from member dues. When we spy you along our holiday parade route on The Fourth, we will wave and shout a cheerful greeting, and when we see you at the Bala Cynwyd Playground after the parade, we will offer a hearty handshake and a broad, welcoming smile. Only you will know if you have paid your dues for this year, but you will feel much better about yourself if you have, for you will know that you are a better citizen for it, doing your best to support your prosperous suburban community through your civic association, The Neighborhood Club.

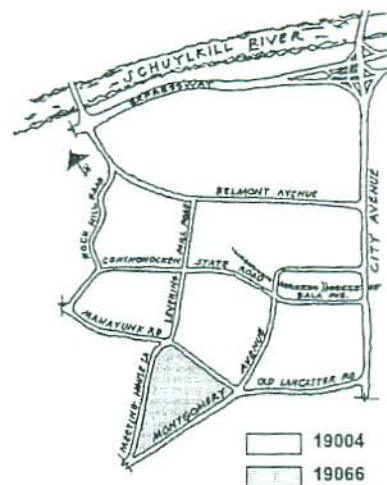

New Restaurant Planned for Bala-Cynwyd Shopping Center

The Will Charbonets, holders of Qdoba Mexican Grille franchises, came before The NCBC Board to explain their appeal for township Zoning Hearing Board relief for 13 parking spaces. Plans are for Qdoba to occupy the sites formerly leased by Parade of Shoes and Moto Photo, both retailers requiring fewer parking spaces than does a sit-down dining establishment such as Qdoba. Chris Weber of Federal Realty, Bala-Cynwyd Shopping Center managers, introduced the proposed tenants to the Board.



The Charbonets explained that their restaurant is characterized as "fast casual," will be outfitted with about 75 seats, will provide both take-out and catering services, and will not be licensed for alcohol. All menu items are prepared fresh daily at each Qdoba restaurant. Plans are for this newest Bala-Cynwyd Shopping Center dining spot to open in the summer of 2005.

The Qdoba presentation was consistent with the custom of all seekers of a zoning variance for property in Bala Cynwyd to come before The Neighborhood Club Board to plead the case prior to visiting the zoning board. The Neighborhood Club Board takes one of two positions regarding any zoning issue that comes before it: the Board either objects to the appeal, or takes no position. In the case of the Qdoba appeal, there were no objections from Board members, so the Board voted to take no position.

Stay-At-Home Parents Get Support in Bala Cynwyd

Those of us who have spent time at home caring for our young children know the feeling of isolation that such a commitment can produce. Many who choose to be the primary caregiver in their children's lives had a former "life" involving them in a vibrant work community, one that provided them with the opportunity not only to have regular conversations with other adults, but also to take part in projects that involved planning, organizing and reaching out beyond the confines of their own domestic situations.

A national organization, MOMS (Mothers Offering Mothers Support), recognizes the needs faced by those of us who are committed to staying at home with our children, but who also feel the need for complementary involvement in the community. The Bala-Cynwyd/Merion chapter of MOMS meets monthly at the St. Matthias Parish Center on Bryn Mawr Ave. in Bala Cynwyd. (Dads are welcome, too.) Members receive mom's nights out, and participate along with their children and other parents in weekly playgroups or outings. In addition, the organization does charitable work. Their current project is The People's Shelter for Homeless Moms and Children in Philadelphia. Annual dues are \$20. For more details, call Lori Frank at 610 664-2989.

Aircraft Noise Over Bala Cynwyd

Several neighbors have commented on the excessive noise of helicopters and airplanes operating over our neighborhood, at seemingly low altitudes. These aircraft may be on approach to Philadelphia International Airport, or they may be traffic helicopters following the Schuylkill Expressway or other congested roads. The FAA has set up a website to report excessive and repeating aircraft noise, so they may monitor and possibly act to reduce these noise impacts. Volunteer Medical Provides Essential Service to All



Volunteer Medical Service Corps (VMSC) began during World War II to provide medical transport to the residents of Narberth Borough. In the ensuing sixty years, the scope of our services and the population we serve has grown dramatically. VMSC is now Montgomery

County's designated 9-1-1 Emergency Medical Service (Basic and Advanced Life Support) for the 106,000 residents and 7,000 businesses in Narberth, Conshohocken and West Conshohocken Boroughs and Lower Merion Township; and Advanced Life Support for the 30,000 residents and 600 businesses in Radnor Township. We are a non-profit 501(c)3 volunteer-based ambulance company that responds to over 7,100 9-1-1 calls each year. In addition to ambulance service, we operate a bike unit, an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) as well as educational and training events and programs for the community.

We provide a very elemental human service — saving lives and contributing to the best possible outcome for victims of medical emergencies. Our education and training program reflects our belief that education is a primary tool for our work. In fact, the excellence of our medical service, training for our crew as well

as other crews, and our role in the life of our community were recognized by the 2004 designation as "Ambulance Service of the Year" by The Pennsylvania Emergency Health Services Council and the 2003 designation of our medical director, Dr. Ben Usatch, "Emergency Physician of the Year."

Our organization is viable because of an enormous commitment of volunteer hours. Contrary to a widely held belief, we are not funded by local tax revenue, though we do receive some small grants from local municipalities. We are funded primarily through the communities we serve via membership drives and donations, as well as by insurance reimbursements. Currently, half of our crew of 106 members is volunteer. Our volunteers give approximately 15,000 hours a year of service, making it possible for us to respond to over 7,000 calls a year.

VMSC (formerly "Narberth Ambulance"), we believe, is an irreplaceably important service that contributes significantly to the quality of life in Bala Cynwyd and the entire Lower Merion community. We rely upon the support of our community to fulfill this important mission.

Public Access TV Can Come to Lower Merion Township

It was our privilege to have Irene McNeil of Wynnewood speak about Public Access Television at our May meeting.

Irene explained that Lower Merion uses only two of the three channels that are offered by Comcast as part of the Franchise Agreement between the Township and Comcast. Other Townships are using their Public Access Channel; however, the community here has not been aware or motivated to use its community channel. In effect, Irene said: "If we don't use it, we lose it."

Irene's message is that Public Access Television can be available for the community to reach all the neighborhoods of Lower Merion and Narberth. Examples of possible users are the Narberth Garden Club, local hospitals, the Ardmore Book Club, St. Charles Seminary, students, Lower Merion Historical Society, The Neighborhood Club of Bala Cynwyd, Rotary clubs, sports clubs, Lower Merion Symphony, Main Line Art Center, volunteer groups, churches, synagogues, Chambers of Commerce, and individuals who want to inform the community about

particular projects or ideas. The latter can include forums and debates about issues happening at the Township or School District levels. The Public Access Channel is entirely for and by the community. Irene showed examples of the offerings of other Public Access Channels.

At the meeting, Ms. McNeil informed us about the studio and equipment for Public Access located at the Comcast building, corner Belmont Ave. and Levering Mill Rd. in Bala Cynwyd. She brought copies of the Franchise Agreement that explains the 3 PEG Channels: P as in Public Access and used by the community, E as in Educational and used by the School District (Channel 6), and G as in Government and used by the Township (Channel 7).

Irene continues to meet with community leaders, individuals and organizations to create a non-profit entity with a community Board of Directors who will manage and recruit programming, financing and volunteers. Irene believes that, by using models of other Public Access Channels

throughout the country, the Township and Narberth can create community television programming that is representative of our own needs. She underscores the importance for the community to take the lead in its own Public Access Channel and make it user-friendly and open to everyone.

Tips on Proper Care of Trees

Two basic tips for tree planting are these:

- Plant the tree so that the root flare is visible.
- Apply mulch so that it is a boon to the tree.

This tree is planted properly because

1. Its root flare is visible.
2. Pine needles, a superb mulch, are left where they fall, keeping down grass and weeds which could compete with the tree for water and nutrients.
3. As pine needles decay, they provide nutrients to the tree.

The trees on the left are improperly mulched because

1. Mulch against the tree's trunk retains moisture, inviting disease and insect infestation.
2. Mulch piled against the tree's trunk is wasted since bark is dead and cannot absorb either water or nutrients.

The trees on the right are properly mulched because

1. The mulch is compost which, along with wood chips and pine needles, is an acceptable mulch. These mulches improve soil structure and allow beneficial organisms to thrive. Avoid plastic, stone, and sawdust.
2. The mulch is 2-4 inches deep, but is not allowed to touch the tree's trunk.
3. The mulch reaches to the tree's dripline, thereby providing nutrients, retaining moisture, guarding against mower and trimmer damage, reducing soil compaction, and moderating soil temperatures.

expand, many of its neighbors complained that they didn't want the "800 pound gorilla" to destroy their neighborhood.

Even more distressing to Commissioners was the reaction of a very vocal minority of residents in the Ardmore area, who decried our efforts to revitalize Lancaster Avenue as our being disrespectful to the historic district and past glories of the corridor.

In addition to the School District's difficulties in rebuilding the two high schools and finding places to locate its buses, our fledgling efforts to make Rock Hill Road a pleasing second entrance to the eastern part of the Township, and our attempts, in Gladwyne, to respond to Waverly Heights' request to build more nursing beds to care for the very elderly, the continued refrain of "don't change anything" and/or "not in my backyard" is in many instances hurled at us in angry, often disrespectful, terms. As a Commissioner, I believe that I and my fellow Commissioners were not elected to do nothing, but that, as representatives of the citizenry, we have a responsibility to strive to improve the wellbeing of the Township today . . . and tomorrow.

That is why it is so rewarding for me to represent Bala Cynwyd and to recognize our neighborhood for its sensitivity and willingness — respectfully and professionally expressed through The Neighborhood Club of Bala Cynwyd's Board of Directors — to both preserve and protect the easternmost portion of the Township while recognizing its place as one area within a larger township.

Accordingly, on this July 4th I will be tipping my hat to The Neighborhood Club of Bala Cynwyd and to the many wonderful residents it represents.

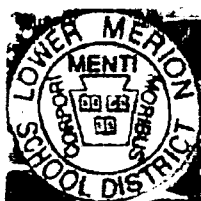

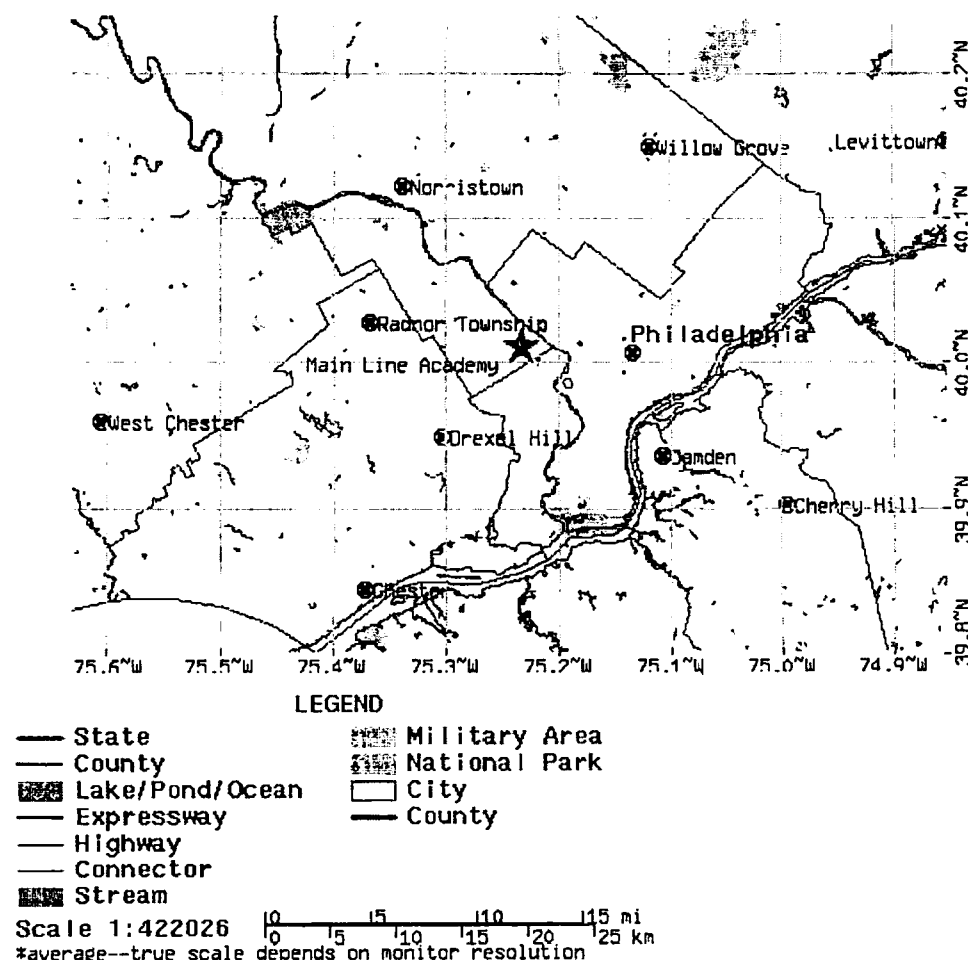

Bala Cynwyd Library History

The Women's Club of Bala Cynwyd founded the Bala Cynwyd Library in 1915. The original plan to house the library in the Academy Building of the School Board of Lower Merion never materialized. A room was secured at a nominal rent in the Union Fire House. The library opened to the public there in July 1915 with 1,078 donated books. In its early years volunteers staffed the Library. In 1922 Marie L. Thompson became the Library's first paid employee and served as Head Librarian until 1929.



A need for more space prompted a fund raising campaign to construct a new library. Property on Levering Mill Road was purchased where a new facility was erected and dedicated to the memory of those who lost their lives in World War I as well as a tribute to all who had served in that war. The cornerstone was laid on Armistice Day, November 11, 1926 and the completed building, designed by William Cramp Scheetz, was dedicated in March 1927.

The years between 1927 and the 1960s were years of continuous growth and expansion. In 1929 the Library hired its first professional Head Librarian, Anna Carey, who served until her 1946 retirement. The Children's Department began programming, and hosted guest authors such as Marguerite DeAngeli, Betty Cavanna, Susan Purdy, and Jean Horton Berg.

By the 1960s the library had again outgrown its quarters. At the same time, the Lower Merion School District was in need of a new elementary school building. The Bala School, built in 1888, was experiencing a space shortage. With two needs coinciding, the community felt it would not be able to bear the financial burden of building two new facilities, and this is how the library/school complex on the present Old Lancaster Road and North Highland Avenue location came to be. The 3-½ acre Faust property was purchased in 1969 by the Township that in turn sold the property in 1970 to the Lower Merion School District for the joint development of school and library needs. Groundbreaking on the new building occurred in January 1973, and construction was completed in the spring of 1974. The Library officially opened its doors to the public July 1, 1974. The new building was dedicated September 22, 1974 and received much attention nationally as a model public school/public library project.

In 1978 the Lower Merion School District decided to close four schools due to declining enrollment, including the Bala School. In July 1982 the Solomon Schechter Day School signed a lease-purchase agreement and occupied the other side of the library building until they sold to L'Ecole Francaise in July 1997. The French School took settlement on July 10, 1997 and began occupation of the school part of the building in August 1997.

The Bala Cynwyd Library serves as the Reference Resource Library on the eastern end of the Township and has a special emphasis on music. Since moving to Old Lancaster Road,
