Multiple Ownership Compliance

Assignee's parent Univision Communications Inc. ("Univision"), through subsidiaries, owns one AM station and two FM stations in the New York, New York Metro radio market ("NY Metro"): WADO(AM), New York, NY; WCAA(FM), Newark, NJ; and WQBU-FM, Garden City, NY. The instant transaction involves the exchange of WCAA(FM) for WQXR-FM, New York, NY, another station located in the NY Metro. Thus, before and after consummation of the exchange transaction, Univision would continue to own one AM and two FM stations in the NY Metro.¹ Univision's ownership of three radio stations in the NY Metro – well below the maximum of eight radio stations (not more than five in one service) permissible in the largest radio metros such as the NY Metro – was most recently approved by the Commission pursuant to its grant of a long-form transfer of control application in March 2007. *See Shareholders of Univision Communications Inc.*, 22 FCC Rcd 5842 (rel. 03/27/07) ("2007 Decision").²

¹ While the community of license of WQBU-FM, Garden City, is located geographically within the NY Metro (and classified by BIA as part of the NY Metro), the station also is listed by BIA as "home" to the Nassau-Suffolk, New York Metro. The parties to this application do not have, and would not have by grant of this application, an attributable interest in a second radio station classified by BIA as in the Nassau-Suffolk, New York Metro, and, thus, such ownership would remain compliant with the local radio ownership rule.

² Pursuant to the 2007 Decision grant of the long-form application, the Commission also approved the continued ownership by Univision of its three NY Metro radio stations in conjunction with its television stations WXTV-DT (Paterson, NJ) and WFUT-DT (Newark, NJ), including its satellite WFTY-DT (Smithtown, NY), which stations are located in the New York, New York television market (the 1st ranked DMA). Because the instant transaction involves the exchange of one NY Metro FM radio station for another NY Metro radio station, Univision's proposed radio-television ownership would remain compliant with Section 73.3555(c), the radio/TV cross-ownership rule.
