Harlingen-Weslaco-Brownsville-McAllen, Texas DMA

The triggering of the Commission's daily newspaper cross-ownership rule, 47 C.F.R. Section 73.3555(d) (the "Daily Newspaper Cross-Ownership Rule") due to the attributable, non-controlling interests of certain parties to the Transferee will not have any adverse effect on the multiplicity of media voices in the Harlingen-Weslaco-Brownsville-McAllen, Texas area because, as demonstrated herein, the market contains diverse and competitive broadcast and non-broadcast media.

The Harlingen-Weslaco-Brownsville-McAllen Designated Market Area (the "Harlingen DMA") is ranked as the 92nd largest market in the nation by Nielsen Media Research. 1/ The household-to-broadcast television station ratio in the Harlingen DMA is more than seven times greater than that of the nation's largest DMA, New York City. 2/ The Harlingen DMA has a total of seven commercial and non-commercial full-power television stations, including affiliates of ABC, NBC, CBS and PBS. 3/ Both before and after consummation of the proposed transaction, all seven of these stations will be owned by different entities. 4/

In addition to the full-power television stations, there are 13 low-power television stations (including five Class A stations) in the Harlingen DMA, many of which provide additional programming to viewers, including, for example, an Azteca network affiliate (KBDF-LP, Brownsville) providing Spanish-language programming. 5/

The Harlingen DMA also is served by a diverse radio market, including 20 FM stations and 9 AM stations. <u>6</u>/ Radio services available to residents in the DMA include Spanish-language programming (*e.g.*, KGBT(FM), Harlingen; KRIO(AM), McAllen), and religious programming (*e.g.*, KBNR(FM), Brownsville; KRGE(AM), Weslaco), in addition to a wide variety of other talk and music formats. <u>7</u>/

The Harlingen DMA also is well served by multi-channel video programming distributors ("MVPDs"). Approximately 60 percent of households in the Harlingen DMA subscribe to some form of MVPD service, 8/ most commonly cable television service, which has a penetration rate of 46 percent (142,650 households) in the Harlingen DMA and is provided over two separate cable systems, each owned by different cable operators. 9/ Cable subscribers in the Harlingen DMA are primarily served by Time Warner Cable, which carries nearly

300 video and digital audio program channels, including 23 Spanish-language network channels in addition to the retransmission of local Spanish-language broadcast stations. 10/

DBS providers EchoStar and DirecTV also serve subscribers in the Harlingen DMA, and both offer local-into-local delivery of broadcast television stations in the DMA. 11/ Harlingen-Weslaco-Brownsville-McAllen residents also have access to two Satellite Digital Audio Radio Services, Sirius and XM Radio, each offering nearly 200 digital audio channels. 12/ Additionally, Harlingen-Weslaco-Brownsville-McAllen residents are situated in one of the first states in the nation in which both AT&T and Verizon have secured statewide cable television franchises to deploy IPTV services. 13/

With respect to the newspaper market, six daily newspapers and 10 weekly newspapers are published in the Harlingen DMA. 14/ As further described in Exhibit 18-B, principals of one of Transferee's attributable shareholders have a non-controlling, 16 percent attributable interest in Freedom Communications, Inc., which is the publisher of *The Brownsville Herald*, the *Valley Morning Star* and *The Monitor/La Frontera* (collectively, the "Freedom Newspapers"). At least three weekly newspapers published in the Harlingen DMA by other
