

UNIVERSAL SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT – FCC MX GROUP #64

A settlement agreement has been reached between PROTECTING AMERICA’S FUTURE (PAF) and COLORADO ALLIANCE FOR A SECURE AMERICA (CASA).

Under the terms of this settlement agreement:

CASA will voluntarily dismiss their pending LPFM application BNPL-20131018AIE.

PAF will continue prosecuting their pending LPFM application BNPL-20131017AOY and propose unlimited hours as the sole remaining applicant in the MX group¹.

Under the terms of the agreement, there were no payments or other consideration between the two organizations.

CASA has determined that it is in the public interest to enter into a settlement agreement to resolve the mutual exclusivity of its proposal with the proposal of PAF at Loveland, CO. Withdrawal of the CASA application will enable the grant of the PAF application to provide new LPFM service in Loveland, CO. Settlement will therefore serve the objectives of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended and the rules and policies of the Federal Communications Commission. In addition, settlement will conserve Commission resources in the consideration and processing of the proposals.

CASA did not file its application for the purpose of reaching or carrying out such an agreement.

The settlement agreements agreed into by the parties contain the entire understandings and undertakings between the parties pertaining to these matters.
