EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE STATEMENT

Pentecostal Church of God I.M. is an organization registered in the state of California as a non-profit tax exempt entity as of February 24th, 1978. As a result of the changes in our Regional Organization the Bakersfield affiliate was recognized by the State of California as Pentecostal Church of God, I.M., 10RPCA, a non-profit organization on October 26th, 2009.

Pentecostal Church of God, I.M., 10RPCA exists to educate the community about the benefits of spiritual living. Our goal is to educate our community on the benefits of using spiritual principles in everyday life, which includes various social, economic and family issues that affect our community. The wide range of issues that we would be educating our community about are including, but not limited to issues related to financial planning, issues that children face at school, issues related to health, issues regarding farm workers, and issues related to the spiritual well-being.

The pastors and the members of Pentecostal Church of God, I.M. are already involved in the teaching of the Christian spirituality and educating our local community about various social issues. We have organized the annual health fair which has grown from 150 attendees in the first year 2003 to close to 1000 attendees last year. We have also organized the March for Faith, Hope and Love in the city of Bakersfield to pray for our city. The church also partnered with the United States Department of Commerce, U.S. Census Bureau to get farm workers, undocumented immigrants, and indigenous groups such as the Zapotecos living in Bakersfield, California to participate without fear in the Census 2010. A medium of communication such as the proposed KRHM-LP radio would enable us to reach out to our community in a more efficient way. The proposed station will help the church join with the voices of experts on various community issues. In this manner the community can benefit immensely through our programming.
