

### **Request for Special Temporary Authorization**

JBS, Inc. (“JBS”), acting pursuant to Section 73.1635 of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. §73.1635, hereby requests Special Temporary Authorization (“STA”) for low power television station WJHJ-LP, Newport News, Virginia (Facility ID 35137) (“WJHJ” or the “Station”) to remain silent for up to ninety (90) days.

The filing of this STA request – and the timing of its filing – has been precipitated by recent events involving Samuel Jacobs (“Jacobs”), JBS’ President and 70% voting stockholder. On April 13, 2012, following a trial in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Jacobs was convicted of 27 counts of mail fraud, money laundering, engaging in transactions using proceeds from the mail fraud, and forgery. Jacobs is scheduled to be sentenced on September 6, 2012. Jacobs plans to file an appeal with the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. Thus, the Order of the United States District Court is not final, and it will not become final until after the conclusion of the appeals process.

After his conviction, Jacobs executed a Special Power of Attorney and a General Power of Attorney, to authorize his attorney, Nathaniel J. Webb, III, to act on Jacobs’ behalf to oversee the operation of WJHJ and to arrange for the return of Jacobs’ stock to JBS (subject to prior Commission approval). At that juncture, Neal Rosenbaum, who holds the remaining 30% of JBS’s stock, will become the company’s sole stockholder. A Form 315 application will be filed with the Commission shortly to effectuate that plan.

In the meantime, Mr. Webb discovered that WJHJ went off the air on or about September 15, 2011 because of JBS’s failure to make rental payments for the use of a tower in conjunction with Station operations. Mr. Webb, with the approval of Jacobs and the cooperation of Mr. Rosenbaum, is currently taking necessary steps to implement the digital construction permit granted on March 15, 2010 (File No. BDFCDTL-20090824AFH), to operate on Channel 39 in Newport News, Virginia. It is anticipated that the new digital facility will be operational within thirty (30) days.

This STA is being requested to authorize the Station’s continued silence until on-air operations can be restored. JBS is requesting an STA for 90 days to avoid the need for the filing of a subsequent STA request in the event that more than thirty (30) days is required to restore the Station to on-air operation.
