Please note that because you are a viewer of the station and have filed a complaint requesting that the FCC not review the station's license this as a restricted proceeding under Section 1.208 of our Rules (47 C.F.R. §1.1208). As a result I am cannot communicate with you regarding the substance of the proceeding unless representatives of the station are included. As I started to read your e-mail it quickly became apparent that you were discussing substance and providing what the FCC considers a written ex parte presentation. This is the very type of information that is prohibited in a restricted proceeding. Our ex parte rules are laid out under Sections 1.1200 to 1.1216 (47 C.F.R. §1.1200, *et. seq.*).

I immediately stopped reading your e-mail once it was clear that it included substantive matters (the first few words of the fourth sentence). As a result, I can either disregard the remainder of you e-mail, or if you would like it included in the record I will need to forward it to counsel for the station.
