CLAY:

Six maximized applications deemed mutually exclusive were granted on November 12, 2008 subject to the condition that the parties “have resolved their mutual-exclusivity” within 30 days of the Public Notice (November 17, 2008). Failure to meet the condition would result in the automatic cancellation of the grants. Station KBMT-DT is one of the six stations involved in the “daisy chain.” An Interference Agreement has been approved by all of the respective parties and the Agreement should be filed momentarily.

The Construction Permits issued on November 12, 2008 bear the expiration date of February 17, 2009. It is my understanding that the FCC intends to issue a Public Notice announcing that Construction Permit expiration dates will be extended to three years from the initial grant date (November 12, 2008, the grant date of the six applications discussed herein).

The singular purpose of this letter is to confirm “my understanding” and, further, my assumption that it will not be necessary to file an extension of time application.
