

Legal Statement

ABC Radio Los Angeles Assets, LLC. (“ABC Radio”), licensee of FM translator station K256CX, Beaumont, California (“K256CX”), is submitting the instant application (“Application”) for special temporary authority (“STA”) to change the orientation of its authorized antenna from 238 degrees to 310 degrees.¹ No other changes to K256CX’s technical parameters are being requested by this Application.

On July 27, 2017, AMFM Broadcasting Licenses, LLC (“AMFM”), licensee of KGGI(FM), Riverside, California (“KGGI”), filed a complaint with the FCC alleging that K256CX was the cause of interference to KGGI in several areas. ABC Radio has been working diligently and in good faith with AMFM to investigate all of KGGI’s allegations. To this end, as a result of both field measurement tests conducted by ABC Radio and “drive through” listening tests conducted jointly by AMFM and ABC Radio, the parties have determined that K256CX may be the cause of interference to KGGI in certain areas near the 605 Freeway and the 10 Freeway. ABC Radio believes that the reorientation of the K256CX antenna as proposed by the instant Application will remedy any interference at the foregoing location, and ABC Radio has discussed this approach with KGGI’s chief engineer. If ABC Radio determines that operation of the antenna pursuant to this STA resolves all interference concerns, then ABC Radio will work with AMFM to conduct joint tests to confirm that the antenna reorientation has eliminated any interference from K256X to KGGI’s signal. Accordingly, grant of the instant Application is in the public interest.
