EXHIBIT 10 FCC Form 314 Section III, Question 3

This Form 314 application seeks FCC consent to assign the recently granted construction permit for a new Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, television station (BPCT-19960920WV) from LibCo, Inc., a subsidiary of The Liberty Corporation ("Liberty"), to Raycom National, Inc. ("Raycom National"). As reflected in Exhibit 11, Raycom National is a wholly-owned direct subsidiary of Raycom Media, Inc. ("Raycom"). Pursuant to an Agreement and Plan of Merger dated as of August 25, 2005 ("Merger Agreement"), applications were filed with the FCC on September 9, 2005, for consent to the transfer of control of the stations under the control of Liberty (through its subsidiaries LibCo, Inc. and CivCo, Inc.) to Raycom (BTCCT-20050909ADC, et al.).

When the Merger Agreement was executed and the transfer of control applications filed, the Myrtle Beach construction permit had not yet been granted by the FCC but remained subject to a pending application. Accordingly, the Myrtle Beach permit is not covered by the pending transfer of control applications. Schedule 4.16 to the Merger Agreement provides in pertinent part that if the subject construction permit is granted prior to closing of the merger, the parties will file an application on FCC Form 314 for consent to assign the permit to Raycom. The assignment would be consummated immediately prior to, or concurrently with, consummation of the transfer of control of Liberty and its licensee subsidiaries as contemplated by the Merger Agreement. No separate consideration is allocated to the Myrtle Beach construction permit. The portion of Schedule 4.16 to the Merger Agreement that relates to assignment of the permit is being filed in connection with Assignor's Exhibit 4 to the instant application. The Merger Agreement is on file as part of the above-referenced transfer of control applications.

Neither the Liberty stations being acquired by Raycom nor the existing stations owned by Raycom, or in which it has an attributable interest (*see* Exhibit 13) are located in the Myrtle Beach-Florence, South Carolina DMA. Thus, the proposed assignment of the Myrtle Beach permit complies with the multiple ownership rules.
