We achieve our "radio goals" by furthering our current mission of participatory democracy, communication skill development and opening the doors of the city's governing process through media. By partnering with educators we may provide students training in technology, production and public broadcasting. By amplifying the public voice and nurturing inter-generational use, participants will practice citizenry and leadership to create positive communities.

One way to encourage involvement in media education is by starting with the youth. We are interested in establishing on-going relationships with educational & youth-orientated partners (such as the Boy & Girls Club, YMCA, City Year, and the Manchester School District, in general), to create a venue for growth and expression for youth...of every age.

THE AFTER SCHOOL RADIO PROJECT

The After School Radio Project at MPTS will allow middle school and high school students the opportunity to participate in a community media radio

*The most important skill that you can teach a person is the ability to **convey ideas**, to **participate in a dialog**, and to **think and speak** extemporaneously... The After School Radio Project does not create DJs or media announcers...**we create communicators!***

Students will be trained in a series of lessons on the basic operation of the radio board and given an opportunity to learn more about the fundamentals of broadcasting. Ultimately they will work towards a regular timeslot that they will incorporate their own ideas, as well as those of the program directors.

*Each student's **radio program** may divided into three different sections: Interviews, Music, and Topics.*

- The **Interview** section touches on relevant and current issues of importance to the community.*
- The **Music** section allows the student to work in a "programmed" environment and present music eclectically and purposefully to an audience demographic.*
- The **Topic** section requires the student to speak authoritatively on an important subject including disease prevention, health and wellness, nutrition, safety, ethnic customs, historical events, holidays, and information about important writers, painters, and other artists, and infinitely more subjects.*

The important aspect of this project is the end result. Although the radio-station setting is a unique and alternative environment that will attract youth in a way no other community project could, with technology, fun activities, and creative challenges, the end result will always be paramount.

This new community resource that benefits teens and the community at-large would bring about a new dialog, inspiring a response to the issues of the day, a venue for reaction and discussion of

art, music, sports, film, culture or news-information. This will be a place where young participants have a structure, a goal, and feedback—it's more than just "something for kids to do". This may re-instate a celebration of all things local, bestowing our youth in the most important aspect of successful citizenship: the *ability* and *confidence* to communicate.

The Host / Announcer education opportunities






- Year-round access to broadcast facility, not less than 32 hours a week.
- Non-discriminatory public access with both 30min (pre-taped) and 60min (live) program shifts for talk show format programs; and 60min shift opportunities for student music programs and other experimental learning/training programs... A full weeks Program Schedule is printed below.

The Listener education benefits

- Live broadcasts of city council (Board of Mayor & Aldermen) meetings, approximately 8 hours a week of direct-to-the-citizen democracy at work.
- Live broadcasts of high school sporting events ("Go to Gill Stadium, Bring Your Radio")
- Immediate announcements from the city's Emergency Operations Center:

- About 40 new local talk shows a week, presenting listeners with news and opinions from fellow citizens

PUBLIC SAFETY

MPTS is an independent 501c3, however *funded* by the City of Manchester, making our relationship with the City and city departments & emergency services incontrovertible. We are the most direct link between the city and the citizens when communication needs are important. MPTS studios have direct audio (and video) link to the city's EOC (Emergency Operations Center).

Radio will help us augment our ability to convey to the public an array of **safety** and **information** issues as they arrive.

Large Outbreaks, Significant Recalls (food), Public Health Advisories, Contamination Boil Orders.

- **Library**

Library events and programs for all ages, closings, and fun literary and historical facts.

- **Parks and Recreation**

Fun and exciting Parks and Recreation news pertaining to events, park improvements, programming, partnerships and photos

- **Road Closures & Snow Emergencies / Winter Parking Ban**
