Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed December 7, 2006, on behalf of Univision Radio License Corporation ("Univision"). Univision requests a second extension of the special temporary authority ("STA") granted on August 22, 2005, to operate Station KKRG (formerly KJFA) with emergency antenna facilities pursuant to Section 73.1680.<sup>1</sup> Univision requests further extension of STA so that it may continue to provide service while it undertakes repairs to its main antenna.

Our review indicates that, subsequent to the grant of the initial STA, Univision was granted Construction Permit BXPB-20050714ACS, which authorizes the construction of auxiliary facilities identical to the STA facilities. However, the permit contained a special operating condition which requires field strength measurements and/or construction of fencing as necessary to prevent excessive exposure to radio frequency signal strengths in excess of the Commission's limits. The permit was granted on August 31, 2005. The staff's letter dated September 20, 2006, included the following advisory:

**STA may not be used as a means to circumvent the special operating condition of the permit. We extend STA for an additional period of 90 days in order to allow time for compliance with the special operating conditions of the permit and the filing and processing of an application for auxiliary license.**

Our review further indicates that, as of the date of this letter, no application for license to cover the auxiliary permit has been filed. Therefore, the request for further extension of STA IS DENIED. Further operation of the auxiliary antenna, absent compliance with all terms and conditions of the construction permit, in particular the condition regarding human exposure to

radio frequency radiation, IS UNAUTHORIZED. Univision is directed to proceed expeditiously toward filing an application for license which demonstrates compliance with the terms and conditions of the construction permit.
