

Section 307(b) Showing

By the instant application, Bustos Media of Colorado License Corp. (“Bustos”), licensee of KGDQ(FM), Colorado Springs, Colorado (FIN: 70822), requests that the Commission modify the license of KGDQ(FM) to specify Centennial, Colorado as the station’s new community of license, and authorize the construction of modified facilities, which will serve that community. Grant of the application would be consistent with Section 307(b) of the Communications Act, as amended, and would otherwise serve the public interest.

At present, there are no stations licensed to the Centennial community. Accordingly, grant of the instant application would facilitate the introduction of a first local transmission service to Centennial, advancing the Commission’s priorities under Section 307(b).¹ The introduction of first local service to Centennial would be accomplished without depriving Colorado Springs of local transmission or reception service. As indicated in the attached Technical Exhibit, following the proposed change in community of license, Colorado Springs would have fourteen assigned aural transmission services remaining, and would receive at least 19 protected FM services. Grant of the application would result in a net gain of service to 737,000 persons while the “loss” area would continue to be well-served, resulting in no gray or white area. The 70 dBu contour of the proposed facilities would cover 843,000 persons and an area of 2,110 square kilometers, while the 60 dBu contour of the proposed facilities would cover 2,002,500 persons and an area of 5,440 square kilometers.

Although Centennial is located within the Denver Urbanized Area, Centennial has the social, economic, cultural, and political characteristics of a community and is sufficiently independent of Denver to qualify for a first local service. The City of Centennial was incorporated on February 7, 2001, and includes the former Castlewood, Colorado and Southglenn, Colorado Census Designated Places, among other formerly unincorporated areas of Arapahoe County. The U.S. Census estimates Centennial’s 2005 population at approximately 98,243 persons.² This population is the equivalent of approximately 17.7% of the population of Denver city, and approximately 4.95% of the population of the Denver Urbanized Area. The driving distance from Centennial to Denver city is approximately 13.8 miles.³

The Commission considers eight factors in determining whether a community within a larger urbanized area is sufficiently independent: (1) the extent to which community residents work in the larger metropolitan area, rather than the specified community; (2) whether the smaller community has its own newspaper or other media that covers the community’s local needs and interests; (3) whether community leaders and residents perceive the specified community as being an integral part of, or separate from, the larger metropolitan area; (4) whether the specified community has its own local government and elected officials; (5) whether

the smaller community has its own telephone book provided by the local telephone company or zip code; (6) whether the community has its own commercial establishments, health facilities, and transportation systems; (7) the extent to which the specified community and the central city are part of the same advertising market; and (8) the extent to which the specified community relies on the larger metropolitan area for various municipal services such as police, fire protection, schools, and libraries.⁴ Centennial clearly satisfies these criteria, therefore meriting a first local service preference under Commission precedent.⁵

- **Employment Patterns** - A substantial portion of Centennial residents work within Centennial, and not within Denver or other parts of the Denver Urbanized Area. Data from the 2000 U.S. Census shows that, at that time, approximately 17% of Castlewood residents worked within Castlewood, while approximately 15.1% of Southglenn residents worked within Southglenn. *See* Exhibit A. Both of these figures compare favorably with communities previously found to be independent by the Commission.⁶ It stands to reason that, given the recent incorporation of Centennial as a larger, more cohesive civic and economic unit with its own local government, the percentage of Centennial residents working within Centennial is consistent with these figures, if not higher. Accordingly, the first *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.
- **Local Newspaper or Other Media** - Centennial is served by its own weekly newspaper, the *Centennial Citizen*. The *Citizen* serves the local needs and interests of Centennial residents by providing coverage of local politics and government operations, business news, community events, and sports. The *Citizen* also contains a classified section and advertisements that focus on Centennial-based businesses and job opportunities. In addition, Centennial maintains a website that contains pertinent information about government operations, municipal services provided by Centennial, and community activities, and the *Centennial Connection* newsletter.⁷ A separate website provides a community directory detailing local organizations and businesses and providing advertising.⁸ Accordingly, the second *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.⁹
- **Perceptions of Independence** - Centennial's community leaders and residents clearly perceive Centennial to have an identity independent from that of the Denver Urbanized Area. When Centennial was incorporated in 2001, it was as the result of civic activism consisting of over 100 regional town meetings and an extensive campaign to create a new local government. The incorporation – the largest in U.S. history – is itself the best

evidence of community's perceptions of its independent identity. Citizens and public officials are proud of the City's heritage, and demonstrate a civic pride that is founded upon community independence and self-determination. Upon retiring, one Council Member urged citizens to remember that "It's Our City," and to always remember the City's unique heritage. *See* Exhibit B. Centennial's local government has built upon this sense of community identity by regularly inviting citizens to serve in policy-making posts, shoulder-to-shoulder with city council members on standing committees. Accordingly, the third *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.¹⁰

- ***Local Government and Elected Officials*** - Centennial has its own local government and elected officials. The Centennial City Council is composed of a Mayor and eight Council Members, two from each of the City's four wards. *See* Exhibit C. Centennial has its own Municipal Court, which interprets and applies, *inter alia*, the Centennial Municipal Code. Centennial has separate offices managing: Animal & Mosquito Control; Building Permits & Inspections; Contractor Licensing; Land Use; Liquor Licensing; Planning & Development; Public Works; and Zoning. *Id.* Accordingly, the fourth *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.¹¹
- ***Independent ZIP Code*** - Centennial is effectively covered by six ZIP Codes (80015, 80016, 80111, 80112, 80121, 80122). *See* Exhibit C. Centennial is also served by its own post office, located at 2221 E Arapahoe Road, Centennial, CO 80122-9998. Accordingly, the fifth *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.¹²
- ***Local Commercial Establishments*** - Centennial is served by an array of local commercial establishments. *See* Exhibit D. These include Centennial Bank, Centennial Travel, Centennial Food and Beverage, Centennial Executive Suites, Centennial Collision Center, and numerous restaurants, shops, and other local businesses. Centennial is served by its own churches, healthcare facilities, including the Centennial Medical Plaza, and its own airport, Centennial Airport. Moreover, Centennial's city government is dedicated to expanding business opportunities within the City. For example, the City is currently participating in the redevelopment of the former Southglenn Mall, which will be renamed The Streets at Southglenn. *Id.* Accordingly, the sixth *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.¹³
- ***Independent Advertising Market*** - Centennial is part of an independent advertising market. As noted above, Centennial is served by a weekly newspaper, in addition to several websites that provide advertising. Moreover, if the Commission grants the instant application, KGDQ(FM) will provide an additional outlet for advertising targeted to the Centennial community. Accordingly, the seventh *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.¹⁴

- ***Independent Municipal Service*** - Centennial does not rely on the Denver Urbanized Area for its municipal services. *See* Exhibit C. Centennial has its own fire protection service, libraries, park and recreation services, schools, water, and utilities services.¹⁵ In addition, Centennial contracts with Arapahoe County – which is independent of the city and county of Denver – for law enforcement, animal control, public works, and elections services, although the City is expected to provide even more services independently as it matures.¹⁶ Accordingly, the eight *Tuck* factor has been satisfied.

In short, Centennial manifests the characteristics of an independent community, notwithstanding its proximity to Denver city. Centennial has a large population that is governed by an independent city government. That government was created to realize the community's desire for an independent social, cultural, economic, and political identity. Centennial residents elect their own officials, participate in local government, and benefit from municipal services provided by the City. Centennial is home to numerous local businesses, including a hospital, an airport, a newspaper, and a post office. In light of these facts, there can be no doubt that Centennial deserves a first local transmission service preference. For these reasons, Bustos respectfully requests that the Commission grant the instant application.







Council Member George Gatseos Bids Farewell

Wednesday, January 14, 2004

Retiring Council Member George Gatseos read the following statement upon his retirement from city council on Jan. 12, 2004:

TO: Mayor Pye, City Council, City Staff, and Centennial Citizens

FROM: George G. Gatseos II, Council Member Ward I

Thank you for allowing me to address Council, Citizens, and City Staff, during this special meeting as we seat the new Centennial City Council. Let me first thank the constituents in Ward I for electing me as one of their first two Council Members. And for allowing me to serve them on Council till the end of my terms, I have done my best to represent all 25,000 of you during these past three years.

I have not been perfect but believe I have done my very best. On Sunday afternoon, I went over to the Pavilion A at Julia DeKoevend Park and revisited the four trees that were planted in June 2001 by our Founding Fathers representing the four wards of the City. I am proud to tell you that they are all growing and are healthy, just as this great city of ours. Remember, "It's our City".

My comments will be brief and as one of my favorite authors on Leadership writes; "A leader's lasting value is measured by succession."

When all is said and done your ability as a leader will not be judged by what you achieved personally or even by what your team accomplished. You will be judged by how well your organization did after you were gone. I sincerely believe that I am leaving a great team of Council Members and want to thank all of you for your support as part of the "family."

I will remember diverse things, such as the Sunday morning early call from the Mayor telling us about the car that crashed into and destroyed our temporary city offices at the bank building. I will remember the day we moved ourselves with citizen volunteers into the City's new "digs" our very first own Council Chamber.

I remember hiring our very first City Manager and giving our acting City Services Administrator, thanks for serving us during that busy first year when we were both "staff" and also elected officials.

I could list so much more and tell you all that we have succeeded in establishing a great City! I wish to thank Mayor Pye for his leadership qualities and his patience with me while serving on this Council.

I sincerely appreciate and thank all of you who helped me remain active on Council during the fall of 2002 recuperating from heart bypass surgery.

As I leave office I have just one more request of Council; could you please send to me my own copy of the Farnsworth Map of the City that is hanging on the wall in our council

chambers? Please, let me read the bottom of the map for you to remind us of our wonderful "Heritage" and history. Please pass it on to new council members and I ask Centennial's future Councils to always remember this and to always keep the "Main thing the Main thing"!

SELF- DETERMINATION.....CREATION OF A NEW CITY

"Arapahoe Citizens for Self Determination (ACSD) was a non-profit organization representing citizens and businesses concerned about the future of unincorporated Arapahoe County. Launched on July 8, 1998, ACSD led the effort to create the City of Centennial. On behalf of ACSD, Farnsworth Group, prepared a description and a map of the Territory to be Incorporated, at the time comprising over 27 square miles with a population over 103,000. Petitions requesting formation of the City of Centennial, which included the map and territory description, were signed by more than 2,400 voters and filed with the Arapahoe County District Court on December 18, 1998. Attorneys Robert G. Cole and Derek G. Passarelli, of the law firm Collins Cockrel & Cole, represented the Centennial Petitioners in hearings before the District Court on January 19th, February 1st and 2nd, and March 8th and 9th, 1999, to argue the validity of Centennial's Petitions and their priority over competing annexation proposals. The District Court issued an Order on April 8, 1999 finding that the Centennial Petitions, map, and territory description were valid, and that they would take priority over competing annexation proposals. The District Court's determination was sent on appeal to the Colorado Supreme Court. Bob Cole argued the case to the Colorado Supreme Court on May 3, 2000. On June 26th, 2000, the Colorado Supreme Court issued a Unanimous opinion in favor of Centennial on all issues. At long last, the incorporation election was held on September 12, 2000. With the support of thousands of volunteers who organized 100 town meetings, placed 19,000-yard signs, distributed over 250,000 pieces of literature, staffed 85 grocery store tables. And probably displayed over 20,000 bumper stickers, Centennial was approved by a Stunning 77% majority with a record-setting 48% turnout. The City of Centennial now stands as the largest incorporation in American History."

I love this City and look forward to serving it's Youth Commission in an advisory capacity as needed, and wanted you all to know, "I LIVE IN CENTENNIAL BECAUSE IT'S THE BEST SPOT IN AMERICA"

City Facts

Centennial's Origin

Residents voted to incorporate the City of Centennial on September 12, 2000 and elected its first officials on February 6, 2001. Centennial officially became a city on February 7, 2001. The quest for a new city took almost two and half years. The campaign included victories in the state legislature and state Supreme Court. Formation of the new city was approved by a 77 percent margin in the incorporation election. It was the largest city incorporation in U.S. history.

The origins of Centennial gained national recognition in *Governing Magazine*. The story can be viewed through *Sudden City*.

Governance

The City of Centennial is what is known as a mayor-council style statutory city. This classification, in contrast to a home-rule city, limits the authority that the city exercises, primarily in the area of taxes and tax collection. The city consists of a citywide elected mayor and eight council members, two elected from each of Centennial's four wards. The city also elects a citywide treasurer and citywide city clerk. Council members serve staggered four-year terms; the city treasurer and city clerk serve two-year terms. The City Council employs a city manager to direct the day-to-day activities and functions of the city.

Location

The City of Centennial is Colorado's newest city, located in the southern Denver metropolitan area, entirely within Arapahoe County. Centennial is adjacent to the cities and towns of Aurora, Englewood, Foxfield, Greenwood Village, Highlands Ranch (unincorporated Douglas County), Littleton, Lone tree, and Parker.

Total Area

Centennial encompasses 28.24 square miles, or 18,071.24 acres.

Population

With approximately 103,000 residents and 36,200 households, Centennial is the fourth largest city in the Denver Metro Area.







Animal Control

The City of Centennial contracts with Arapahoe County for several city services, including animal control. The following City of Centennial ordinances apply to animal control within the City limits:

- *Running-at-Large*: Dogs must be under the control of their owners at all times on public or private property. Dogs may not be on private property without the permission of the property owner.
- *Barking Dog*: The City of Centennial does have a noisy dog ordinance.
- *Animal Licensing*: All dogs must be licensed annually, by March 1. Apply for a new license or renewal either in person at the address below, or use the form found here. It may be printed out, filled in and then mailed with payment and required attachments.

Animal Control licenses dogs, and responds to a variety of animal issues, including

- Animal bite tracking/recording
- Noisy dog complaints
- Releasing small wildlife from houses
- Capture & release of snakes
- Stray animal hospitalization
- Stray animal impoundment

- Dead animal pick-up & disposal
- Live-animal traps for up to seven days.

There are no ordinances governing cats in Centennial.

The arrival of West Nile Virus has required significant attention to mosquito control. In 2004 Centennial was surveyed for mosquito breeding sites, and as additional sites are discovered they are added to the control efforts. The 2005 mosquito season began with more than 70 known breeding sites on public property that were checked weekly and treated with larvacide as needed. This program continues in 2006 and also works with private property owners who may have standing water on their property.

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Business Licenses & Taxes

Currently, the City of Centennial does not have a business licensing program.

Retail businesses in Centennial must currently collect a 2.5% sales tax for the city and remit it to the Colorado Department of Revenue.

Businesses subject to sales tax collection who wish to operate in the City of Centennial must obtain a sales tax license from the Colorado Department of Revenue, 303-866-3091.
