To Whom it may concern:

I, Tina Scott, a practicing attorney in the State of Mississippi and member of the Mississippi State Bar, assisted Mr. William Morgan, now deceased, and his wife Mrs. Katherine Ann Morgan relative to their final wishes for the disposition of their property.

I now write in representation of the Estate of William Earl Morgan, Jr. Mr. Morgan's Last Will and Testament provides that any and all property solely in his name, *i.e.*, now comprising his estate, is to become the sole property of Ms. Kathryn Ann Morgan or her assignee.

It is my understanding that the only property solely in Mr. Morgan's estate is that relative to rights and privileges related to the operation of two local television station. Given the relatively small size and value of Mr. Morgan's Estate, and as authorized by the laws of the State of Mississippi, the decision was made to forgo probate through the court, and instead, to take care of Mr. Morgan's Estate by way of a Small Estate Heirship Affidavit and Assignment, whereby Mr. Morgan's sole heirs-at-law are noted to be: his wife, Katherine Ann Morgan, and their three (3) adult sons; with the three (3) sons, each and all, in assent and compliance with Mr. Morgan's Last Will and Testament, having assigned any and all of their interest in and to any and all property of the Estate of William Earl Morgan, Jr., to their Mother, Katherine Ann Morgan, with all rights and authority for the disposition of that property.

Accordingly, and commensurate therewith, under Mississippi law, (i) Katherine Ann Morgan is legally authorized to serve as a Representative of the Estate, and (ii) in the Representative capacity, is vested with the necessary authority and right to sell, barter, or otherwise dispose of any and all property in the Estate of William Earl Morgan, Jr.
