

Multiple Ownership Compliance

Upon consummation of the transactions contemplated by the Joint Plan of Reorganization for Cumulus Media Inc. and its debtor affiliates pursuant to Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code by which Cumulus Media Inc., Debtor-in-Possession, and certain of its direct and indirect subsidiaries will emerge from bankruptcy as reorganized entities (collectively, “Reorganized Cumulus”), Reorganized Cumulus will hold the FCC licenses for 338 radio stations (the “Stations”) in ninety (90) radio markets. As demonstrated in Exhibit 6 to this Application, there currently are four (4) stations in four separate markets that will be required to be divested to bring the grandfathered clusters into compliance with Section 73.3555(a)(1) of the Commission’s local radio ownership rules. The proposed transferees are not seeking any waivers to permit continued ownership of those grandfathered clusters. Instead, as stated in Exhibit 6, an FCC Form 314 assignment application is being filed concurrently herewith to assign the licenses for those four stations to an insulated divestiture trust to bring the grandfathered clusters into compliance with Section 73.3555(a)(1) of the Commission’s rules. Reorganized Cumulus plans to consummate that divestiture transaction prior to or simultaneously with the closing of the reorganization transaction proposed in this Application.

The ownership and control of the Stations which are the subject of this Application will comply with the Commission’s local radio ownership rules. Attachment A hereto demonstrates that common ownership of the Stations will continue to comply with Section 73.3555(a)(1) of the Commission’s rules using the Commission’s Nielsen Metro methodology. Attachment B hereto demonstrates that common ownership of the Stations will continue to comply with the local radio ownership rules utilizing both Nielsen Metros as well as the Commission’s interim contour-overlap methodology.
