Ron: I understand that the Amendment reduced the amount of the overlap but did not eliminate it completely. Because of the type antenna that KTUD-CD must share with other stations broadcasting from its site and the antenna pattern, for KTUD to fit entirely within its licensed contour, the station would have to reduce its power down to almost nothing. The reason for filing an Amendment reducing power beneath the current licensed power is to reduce population outside the licensed contour, which now stands at an increase of barely 2,000 persons out of a service area population of over 1,340,000. That is truly a de minimus amount and shows that the purpose of this minor change application was not to increase the service area population but to get the station on the air quickly,. Any additional service area is completely over desert and in no way, shape or form constitutes a threat to the Commission's repacking plans. It is my understanding that Aaron Shainis has been speaking to the Division Chief regarding this case. Lee Peltzman
