Please accept this letter on behalf of my client, Regents of the State of New Mexico, regarding the operation of TV translator station K49GV. This letter requests that the status of the license be identified as silent.

The equipment and installation resources to permanently operate the facilities as described in the license granted have been delayed in the manufacturing process. Temporary equipment was assembled to meet the construction permit requirements that matched the facilities outlined in the construction permit and operations were conducted for a brief time. However, this equipment was required to be returned to the owner for its own operation and thus was not available for a long term basis. The schedule for delivery of the equipment for K49GV has been forecasted to be received in the next 3 months. Installation resources for permanent facilities are expected to be available within one month of the equipment delivery so it is anticipated that within 4 months time, K49GV will be operational and a subsequent notice will be provided to the FCC indicating the resumption of operation.
