Dear Applicant:

On September 16, 2009, the licensee as addressed above was sent a deficiency letter outlining the following interference issue:

Our preliminary engineering review reveals that your proposed facility does not comply with the Commission's interference rules. Specifically, the proposal is predicted to cause interference to the following facilities:

1. KABB, San Antonio, TX. – BPCDT-19991028AAR

You were given the opportunity to file a minor amendment to resolve the specified interference problem within (30) days from the date of this letter. Amendments must be filed electronically. If not so amended, your application will be considered incomplete and subsequently dismissed.

Our records indicate that an amendment was received on October 15, 2009, in response to the above reference deficiency letter. Our preliminary engineering review reveals that your proposed facility still does not comply with the Commission's Interference rules. Specifically, the proposal is predicted to cause interference to the same station that was indicated in the above referenced 30 day letter.

Your exhibit attachment requested the use of a Full Service Mask; however, we are not accepting or using the Full Service Mask in our interference analysis until it becomes part of our technical rules.

The above referenced application is considered incomplete and IS HEREBY
DISMISSED.
