Educational Programming

VCY America, Inc. is a non-profit educational organization. Contemporaneously herewith, WWJC is filing a license application requesting to change the Station to a non-commercial educational station. Upon consummation of the assignment of license of WWJC to VCY, VCY will operate the Station as a non-commercial educational station, in the same manner as it operates its other stations. The Commission previously has found that the educational objectives and programming of VCY qualify it for status as a non-commercial educational licensee. See FCC File No. BPED-19930702MC. VCY's educational objectives include:

1. To provide religious instruction and moral teaching;
2. To teach troubled youth ways to respond to a world of gangs, drugs, and violence and to find a meaningful and productive lifestyle;
3. To provide the opportunity for and to promote informative discussion and debate in areas pertaining to contemporary, social and religious issues, as well as citizenship and its responsibilities;
4. To provide solutions to community problems such as teenage pregnancy, drug and alcohol abuse, pornography and indecency, the breakdown of the family unit, crime, the economy, the environment and education; and
5. To teach citizenship, patriotism, peaceful conflict resolution, and family life enhancement.

In accordance with the five general purposes enumerated above, the applicant will provide a number of regular programs which advance its various educational objectives. For each of the first four purposes, specific programs are listed that help to advance multiple educational purposes. Each program is listed only once. The fifth purpose enumerated above is generally advanced by most of the programs listed here.

The first educational objective, to provide religious instruction and moral teaching, is advanced by a number of programs including:

- **Back to The Bible:** A daily program of Bible teaching.
- **Bible Tract Echoes:** Instruction on mission work using freely available printed literature.
- **Getting the Message:** Instruction on developing topical Bible studies with examples.
- **Grace to You:** Lectures dealing with Bible topics by nationally-known pastor and Bible teacher John MacArthur; study notes are available.
- **In Touch:** Hard-hitting lectures teaching the Bible by nationally-known Pastor Charles Stanley, from First Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia.

- **Love Worth Finding:** Pastor Adrian Rogers delivers daily messages addressing many moral and spiritual issues.
- **Stories of Great Christians:** A dramatized historical story of Christian leaders from the past.
- **Sunday Sermon:** A Sunday morning sermon for those not able to attend a local church.
- **Thru The Bible:** A daily course, with notes and outlines available that covers the entire Bible over five years.
- **A Visit with Mrs. G.:** A program that teaches stories of the Bible in a captivating setting, told by a "grandmotherly" hostess.

The second educational objective, to teach troubled youth ways to respond to a world of gangs, drugs, and violence and to find a meaningful and productive lifestyle, is also advanced through specific programming:

- **Adventures Of Patch The Pirate:** Dramatized stories of adventure on board a ship teaching character and morals.
- **Bookshelf:** Dramatized stories of wholesome children's literature, demonstrating strong family relationships and moral strength.
- **Children's Bible Hour:** A program to train children in ethical behavior using drama, discussion, music, and other activities that has been broadcast for over 50 years.
- **Fables Of Faith:** Dramas featuring animal characters to teach children the principles of getting along with one another, such as love, joy, peace, patience, honesty, good workmanship, and acceptance of others who may be "different".
- **Kid's Talk:** A program that presents topics like good child-parent relationships and good moral living through music, discussion and dramatized stories.
- **Ranger Bill:** A dramatic adventure by the Moody Bible Institute, giving children a positive role model for living lives of courage and integrity.
- **Jonathan Park:** A program using adventure and scientific facts to teach children.

The third educational objective, to provide the opportunity for and to promote informative discussion and debate in areas pertaining to contemporary, social and religious issues, as well as citizenship and its responsibilities, is also advanced through a variety of programming:

- **Worldview Weekend Radio:** A live interactive radio program that addresses the variety of worldviews in contemporary culture compared to a Biblical worldview.
- **Phyllis Schlafly Report:** A commentary on current events and issues from a conservative viewpoint.

- **Crosstalk:** Live interview and call-in program with guest experts, often discussing issues of current importance.
- **Freedom's Call:** A commentary that explains First Amendment rights such as free speech and the free exercise of religion.

The fourth educational objective, to provide solutions to community problems such as teenage pregnancy, drug and alcohol abuse, pornography and indecency, the breakdown of the family unit, crime, the economy, the environment and education, is advanced through a variety of programming:

- **The Christian Working Woman:** Instruction and encouragement for working women offered by a working woman herself.
- **Revive Our Hearts:** A discussion of problems faced by women in today's society including marriage, husband-wife relationship, and death of a mate, treated from a Biblical perspective.
- **Heaven And Home Hour:** A lecture and interview program addressing a number of family and personal problems such as time management and family-related stress.
- **Home School Heartbeat:** A program that provides information about home schooling.
- **Inspiration Time:** A program for senior citizens including inspirational music and specific issues such as avoiding "scam artists" and taking safety precautions.
- **Joni & Friends:** A program that provides information on the disabled and their relations with society and the Church, hosted by Joni Earackson Tada, a quadriplegic.
- **Unshackled:** A presentation of true stories from the Pacific Garden Mission in Chicago, demonstrating how people have defeated problems such as alcoholism, drugs, sexual promiscuity, gambling and profanity.

The fifth educational objective, to teach citizenship, patriotism, peaceful conflict resolution, and family life enhancement, is relatively general and is advanced by most of the programming mentioned above.

The tremendous variety of programming listed here provides an opportunity to impart education to a broad range of people. The applicant will also provide other programming designed to further its educational objectives.
