TECHNICAL STATEMENT

1. This technical statement and attached exhibits were prepared on behalf of New Century Media, LLC (“NCM”), proposed assignee of radio stations WYRN, 1480 kHz, and WHLQ, Channel 273A, Louisburg, North Carolina. Principals of NCM have attributable interests in the licensees of WPTF, 680 kHz, WBBB, Channel 241C, and WQDR, Channel 234C, Raleigh, North Carolina; and WDNC¹, 620 kHz, Durham, North Carolina.² The city grade contour of WHLQ overlaps with the city grade contour of both WQDR and WBBB. The WYRN city grade contour also overlaps with the 3.16 mV/m contours of WHLQ and WQDR. Further, the WHLQ city grade contour also overlap with the city grade contours of AM stations WPTF and WDNC. There is no overlap of the WYRN 5.0 mV/m contour with either WPTF or WDNC. Based on where the various overlaps occur, two distinct markets would be created based by the acquisition of WYRN and WHLQ by NCM. Market #1 consists of stations WYRN/WHLQ/WQDR, while Market #2 consists of stations WPTF/WDNC/WHLQ/WQDR/WBBB. This results in NCM have common interests in FM and AM stations in two distinct markets. Exhibit #1 is a map depicting the stations.

- 1) There is an outstanding construction permit for WDNC. The permit is for a correction of coordinates only. The difference in the 5.0 mV/m contour of the licensed facility and the permitted facility is de minimus. As such, the permitted facility is shown for this study.
- 2) Principals also have an interest in AM stations WDNZ and WCLY and FM stations WWMY and WKXU. However, none of these facilities are in close enough proximity to WYRN or WHLQ to be considered in this instant analysis.

2. Therefore, a study has been conducted to determine if ownership of these facilities, in the two respective markets, complies with §73.3555 of the Commission's rules. Each market will be reviewed for compliance. Since WQDR is a common station to both markets, its city grade contour will be used to define the market boundary, hereinafter referred to as the "Radio Market". The study will determine the number of other commercial AM and FM stations that either have transmitter sites within or provide coverage to the subject radio market. Exhibit #2 is a depiction of the other stations in the WQDR Radio Market, showing thirteen commercial AM and FM stations, excluding the subject stations

3. Exhibit #3 is a tabulation of the stations in Radio Market #1 (WYRN/WHLQ/WQDR), a total of sixteen stations, including the subject stations. The number of stations depicted falls in the fifteen to twenty-nine stations tier of §73.3555(a)(1)(iii) of the Commission's rules.³ At the fifteen to twenty-nine stations level, common ownership or control of up to six stations, with no more than four in the same service, is permissible.

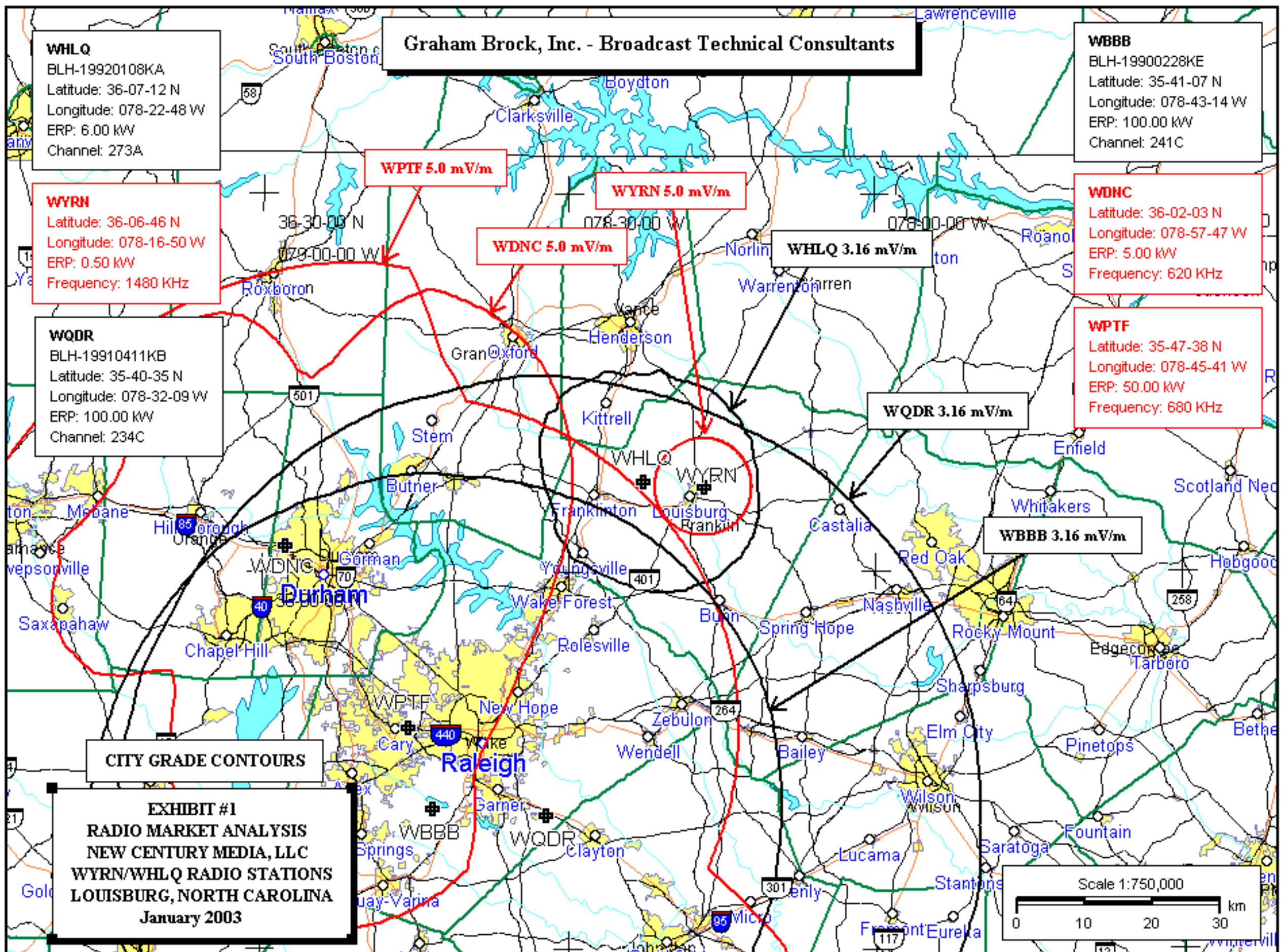
4. Exhibit #4 is a tabulation of the stations in Radio Market #2 (WPTF/WDNC/WHLQ/WQDR/WBBB), a total of eighteen stations, including the subject stations. The number of stations depicted falls in the fifteen to twenty-nine stations tier of §73.3555(a)(1)(iii) of the Commission's rules.⁴ At the fifteen to twenty-nine stations level, common ownership or control

of up to six stations, with no more than four in the same service, is permissible. Therefore, NCM's interests in AM and FM stations in two separate markets are in compliance with the Commission's rules. Therefore, NCM's proposed ownership of WYRN and WHLQ is in compliance with §73.3555 of the rules.
