Silent Since May 6, 2010
Request For Special Temporary
Authority To Remain Silent

Dear Mr. Macintosh:

This letter concerns the request, filed on January 31, 2011, on behalf of Horizon Christian Fellowship ("Horizon"), for Special Temporary Authority to permit the above referenced Stations to remain silent.

Horizon's request states that the referenced stations went silent on May 6, 2010, due to financial reasons. Horizon further states that plans are forthcoming to transfer the stations license. Horizon's request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.


Horizon's request will be granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit the referenced stations to remain silent for a period not to exceed May 6, 2011. **Notwithstanding the grant of this special temporary authority, the broadcast licenses for the referenced stations will automatically expire as a matter**

of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m. May 7, 2011.¹ See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 312(g).

The stations' silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. Finally, we note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the stations' tower shall be maintained until removed. See 47 C.F.R. Sections 17.6 and 73.1740(a)(4).

Finally, the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. Section 73.1740(a)(4), permit licensees to discontinue operations for good cause and for a period not to exceed 30 days without further authority, provided that the licensee notify the Commission by letter "not later than the 10th day of limited or discontinued operations" and if operations are not able to commence by that time, "informal written request shall be made to the FCC no later than the 30th day for such additional time as may be deemed necessary. Horizon recognizes that it failed to timely submit a request for an STA to permit the referenced stations to remain silent beyond June 6, 2010, and the action taken herein shall not be construed as authorizing the stations to remain silent between June 6, 2010, and January 31, 2011.
