Dear Mr. Johnson:

Rocky Mountain Public Broadcasting Network, Inc., licensee of KRMA-TV, Channel 6, Denver, Colorado hereby states that it has no objection to the construction and operation of a proposed power increase for non-commercial/educational FM station KTPL, operated by Educational Communications of Colorado Springs, Inc. ("ECCS"), on 88.3 MHz in Pueblo, CO. It is our understanding that the station has proposed to increase power from 10 kW to 65 kW, change to channel 202 from 201, and specify circular polarization instead of vertical polarization at an elevation of 2593 feet AMSL.

By signing this letter below, ECCS agrees that, if interference to Channel 6 should arise as a result of the proposed power increase in its operations of station KTPL, the station will immediately reduce power to its presently licenses level of 10 kW until a solution to the interference can be found. Rocky Mountain Public Broadcasting Network, Inc. will be the sole judge of whether interference is occurring to Channel 6 as a result of the power increase at KTPL.

ECCS will also supply TVI filters at no cost to listeners whose reception of the Channel 6 signal may be adversely affected by the increased power of the station.
