The Corporation of Grace Orthodox Presbyterian Church of Modesto, California (hereafter, "Corporation") is the agent of Grace Orthodox Presbyterian Church of Modesto, California (hereafter, "Grace OPC") charged with handling temporal matters of the church, including such matters as this application for a low power FM station (hereafter, "LPFM").

The Corporation and Grace OPC would use an LPFM to further educate the community about a nearly lost tradition in Christianity, namely, confessional Presbyterianism. Currently, our means of such education are our worship services on Sundays, our discipleship classes on Wednesdays, and our website which webcasts our Sunday worship services and serves as an archive of the Sunday and Wednesday teachings. An LPFM would advance our educational mission by making this material more easily and widely available to our community.

As an evangelical Christian church, our overall mission is broader still. The mission of the Corporation and of Grace OPC is to promote the public worship of God, the sanctification of believers, the evangelization of the lost, and the defense of the Truth, according to the Scriptures.

I say above that we belong to a "nearly lost" tradition. There are many churches with the words "Reformed" or "Presbyterian" in their names, but they would not be of like faith and practice as ours. Our denomination, the Orthodox Presbyterian Church, is small, with just 30,555 members nationwide; including other churches of like faith and practice, there are only about 500,000 members of such confessional Presbyterian (or confessionally Reformed) churches in North America, or about 0.14% of the total population. Even in evangelical Christian circles, we all would amount to less than 1% of all North American evangelicals. As you see, we are a minority within American Christianity. For comparison's sake, at the founding of our country, it is estimated that 25% or more of the population would have been confessional Presbyterians.

Our radio station would benefit not only our members and visitors but also the community at large by providing a unique choice in broadcast media. Examples of proposed programming include the following:

- Live broadcasts of our worship services on Sundays
- Sermon series from our church, whether expository (e.g. teaching from the books of Genesis or Romans) or topical (e.g. "The Larger Catechism," or "Why We Believe What We Believe")
- Discipleship series from our church; examples of subjects covered include "The Environment and Life Issues," "Eschatology," and "New Testament Bible Survey"
- Music to edify and/or uplift, e.g. hymns, psalms, and other genres as appropriate. In our sample schedule, I have used a classical music service to help broadcast throughout the day
- "Morning Devotional": a live program featuring a combination of prayer, music, Scripture reading and devotional readings, perhaps even with call-ins from listeners with prayer requests

- Selected programs from outside our church, ideally that aren't broadcast by other local outlets

A sample programming schedule is attached.

Our Corporation is not individually registered with the State of California. We are a nonprofit religious organization, and are certified as such as a subsidiary organization to our Presbytery, the Presbytery of Northern California and Nevada of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church, which is itself incorporated in the State of California. Enclosed are a copy of the certifying letter dated October 7, 1998, and the articles of incorporation of our Presbytery. For a further explanation, please see Exhibit 10.
