Section II, Question 5(b)

Pastor James Johnson, a member of Crusade for Christ Temple Church of God in Christ's Board of Directors, also sits on the Board of WFTH-AM, a local radio station. Pastor Johnson meets each of the three criteria under the exception set forth under Section 73.858(a) of the FCC's rules:

- (1) Crusade for Christ Temple Church of God in Christ ("the church") is a multi-faceted organization. The church primarily operates as a place of worship, serving the spiritual needs of the Richmond community, but also has educational and social programs for all age groups on a continuous basis. Although these other programs are an outgrowth of the congregation gathering for worship, they are separate programs with separate volunteers and staff.
- (2) Pastor Johnson's duties are wholly unrelated to the low power radio station. Because of his extensive experience in pastoral leadership, Pastor Johnson's role on the Board of Directors has been to act as overseer for the church's activities. His duties include creation and presentation of sermons, management of the church's facilities and volunteers. Not only does the extensive responsibility of Pastor Johnson in this role leave him unable to take on tasks with respect to the low power radio station, but as described in Exhibit 2, the primary function of the low power radio station will be for education and involvement in service to the Richmond community through regular weekly and bi-weekly programming on topics from health-related, fire safety, and medical emergency . . . to calendar and historical events of interest to the Richmond community at large. These programs are related to programs which Pastor Johnson currently has no connection.

The Executive Director has been assigned primary responsibility for the low power radio station and any decision to air sermons and other programs of Crusade for Christ Temple Church of God in Christ will rest solely with her.

- (3) As demonstrated in this exhibit, Pastor Johnson has recused himself from all decision-making with respect to the low power radio station.
