Dear Mr. Gomez:

Commission records show that Hispanic Christian Community Network, Inc. (“HCCN”) acquired the construction permit for low power television station K49IM (now KJPO-LP), Parker, Arizona on August 24, 2007. That construction permit had an expiration date of March 28, 2009.<sup>1</sup> HCCN filed an application for minor modification of its construction permit on February 23, 2009 to specify a different transmitter site and make other technical changes,<sup>2</sup> and that application was granted March 11, 2009. Less than two weeks later, and the day before the construction permit expired, HCCN filed a license to cover construction of the station.<sup>3</sup> That application was granted on April 7, 2009.

The Commission has now received a complaint that the station was never constructed. Specifically, a member of the public has informed the Commission that he contacted the owner of the transmitter site specified in HCCN’s February 22, 2009 modification application,<sup>4</sup> and was informed by the owner that it has only one tenant at that site – a 1.9 GHz wireless customer – and that KJPO-LP was not on its tower.

It appears from the foregoing that HCCN may have falsely certified in its license application that it had met all the terms, conditions, and obligations set forth in its construction permit. As part of our ongoing investigation of this matter, we require certain information regarding the recent operations of KJPO-LP. This information must be supported by affidavit of you or your agent with personal knowledge thereof. We

request that the following documents and information be provided within fifteen (15) business days from the date of this letter:

- (1) Was KJPO-LP constructed and operated in accordance with all terms, conditions and obligations set forth in its construction permit? If so, provide documentation establishing the dates on which KJPO-LP operated, such as a copy of any lease agreements for use of the authorized transmitter site, agreements regarding the construction of KJPO-LP, and affidavits of persons responsible for the construction and continuing operation of the station. You must also provide the name and telephone number of the contact person for the transmitter site.
- (2) If KJPO-LP was not constructed and operated in accordance with all terms, conditions and obligations set forth in the construction permit, identify all persons who took part in the decision to file the license application, and explain the basis for the decision to file a license to cover the construction of a facility that was not actually constructed. Also provide any written materials, including correspondence, notes and email messages that pertain to the filing of the license application.

Failure to provide the following information, supported by the affidavit of a person with personal knowledge, may result in cancellation of the KJPO-LP license. In addition, in view of this ongoing investigation regarding the construction of KJPO-LP, our grant of the above-referenced license application IS HEREBY RESCINDED pursuant to Section 1.108 of the Commission's rules.<sup>5</sup>
