Madison Baptist Church was incorporated in the state of Alabama on February 6, 1992. Article II of the Articles of Incorporation state the authority and purpose of the corporation as follows:

The nature of the said corporation is religious and as a religious corporation it shall also have the authority to function as a religious, charitable, benevolent and educational corporation.

The educational objectives of the corporation are further defined in Section 2 of the Bylaws of the corporation. Among these objectives are:

- 1) Evangelizing the local community through personal witnessing, worship, evangelical service, training, and educational ministries.
- 2) Strengthening Christians through worship, training, teaching, and education.
- 3) Educating our assembly and our children by establishing day schools, Bible institutes, colleges, day cares, and Sunday schools.

Madison Baptist Church endeavors to meet its educational objectives through several ministries as described below.

Madison Baptist Academy (MBA) is a primary school teaching grades one through twelve. MBA began operation in 1985. The students and staff of the Academy are active in the Alabama Christian Education Association (ACEA), and Dr. Allison, our pastor and president of the corporation, has served as president of the ACEA and board member of the American Association of Christian Schools. The Academy has an excellent academic record, and most of our graduates have successfully continued their education in colleges and universities.

Madison Bible Institute (MBI) is a three year, adult education program teaching the Holy Bible. The course of study consists of six, thirteen week semesters covering New Testament Survey, Old Testament Survey, and Theology. MBI began operation in the fall of 1988. Also, in the fall of 2000, MBI began offering these classes in the Spanish language as an extension of the ministry to the Hispanic population in our community.

Southeastern Fundamental Bible College (SFBC) is a four year Bible college which began operation in 1995. It's purpose is to train those whose desire is to serve in full time Christian ministries. The programs of study include Bachelors of Science degrees in Bible with majors in the areas of general studies, evangelism, missions, and pastoral studies, as well as Graduate in Theology, and Associate in Ministry degrees.

Every year, during the summer vacation season, Madison Baptist Church holds a week long Vacation Bible School and Missions Conference. The Bible school offers the children of the community an opportunity to learn of the Bible and the Christian faith as well as enjoying games, crafts, skits, fun, and refreshments. Missionaries to different parts of the world teach the children giving them an appreciation for different cultures and real life examples of those who minister in foreign lands. Each evening of the week, church services are held where these missionaries present their ministries in the church-wide Missions Conference. The climax of the week, the last night, the children are given an opportunity to show their families and friends what they made and learned during the week.

To augment these educational ministries, Madison Baptist Church is seeking an FCC license for a low power FM radio station. The proposed station programming would inform the community of the Christian educational opportunities available locally. Also, much of the curriculum and activities of these ministries will be adapted for radio broadcast to provide Christian educational programs for children and adults. Programs will include preaching, Bible study and commentary, children's Bible stories, church history, inspirational music, and current events related to Christianity. Other possible programming may include Spanish language programs and music to reach the community's Hispanic population.

Madison Baptist Church is an autonomous and independent local church; it is not part of any ecclesiastical group, but endeavors to carry out its purpose in the community according to the dictates and principles taught in the Holy Bible. A primary objective of the educational ministries of Madison Baptist Church is to provide our local community with a source of Christian teaching that is clearly based on the teachings of the Bible and is practically worked out through the ministries of this local church. Radio will allow us to reach more people with this opportunity for Christian learning, growth, and service in and to their community.
