Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to Section 73.1125(d)(3) of the Rules, World Radio Network, Inc. ("WRN"), licensee of noncommercial educational FM Station KYRM, Yuma, Arizona,^{1/} hereby respectfully requests authority to relocate the main studio of Station KYRM from Yuma to another location that requires a main studio location waiver. Specifically, WRN proposes to move the KYRM main studio from its current location to the main studio of WRN's co-owned NCED-FM station KNOG, Nogales, Arizona. The proposed main studio location in Nogales is outside the principal community contour of KYRM and is 235 miles from the community of license of KYRM.

WRN has installed a satellite uplink facility in Nogales, home of Station KNOG. The programming originated by WRN at Station KNOG is designed specifically to address the needs and concerns of Hispanic listeners. This programming will serve as the foundation for KYRM's daily schedule, supplemented as appropriate by programming addressed to the Yuma, Arizona community.

By relocating KYRM's main studio to KNOG's studio in Nogales, WRN will be able to reduce its operating costs and also maintain its noncommercial educational programming in Yuma. As is the case with all of WRN's Spanish-language stations, KYRM is a listener-supported station. The relocation of KYRM's main studio to Nogales will enable WRN further to centralize its broadcast operations in Arizona, thereby effecting beneficial economies of scale.


To ensure that WRN fulfills its local service obligations to the residents of Yuma, Arizona, WRN will:

- (1) maintain an auxiliary studio in Yuma that will have local program origination capability;
- (2) conduct regular, quarterly ascertainment surveys of local community leaders and other residents to determine the concerns, problems and needs of Yuma listeners, which will be covered in WRN's news and public affairs programming;
- (3) maintain a toll-free telephone number from Yuma to KNOG(FM) in Nogales as required by Section 73.1125(d) of the rules; and
- (4) maintain a duplicate KYRM(FM) public inspection file in Yuma, Arizona.

WRN has previously demonstrated to the Commission's satisfaction that operation of certain of its stations as satellites of KNOG(FM) is consistent with the public interest. (Stations KRMC(FM) and KRMB(FM)). WRN's ability to uplink from its Nogales facility allows it to consolidate the operations of KYRM into the main studio at Station KNOG, thereby reducing costs while maintaining quality programming for WRN's Hispanic audiences. Accordingly, WRN requests that the Commission authorize the operation of Station KYRM (FM) as a satellite of Station KNOG(FM).
