

Statement of Educational Objective of Assignee, The Neighborhood Network

The Neighborhood Network (“TNN”) is a non-stock, not for profit corporation chartered in Ohio as a Section 501(c)3 organization, the tax exempt status of which has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service. TNN hereby attests that it shall operate an FM station to provide a non-profit and noncommercial broadcast service in accordance with Section 73.503 of the FCC rules.

The Neighborhood Network’s Mission

TNN exists to contribute to life-long education, in the broadest sense of the term, in central Ohio:

by providing training in media production, communications and education in media literacy,

by encouraging the production of quality programming, and

by operating and managing public access programming.

The Neighborhood Network’s History

TNN has developed and operated a training program in video production and editing; produced video programs for airing on local educational and government cable access channels and a website; aided in producing public service announcements for local non-profit organizations; operated a media production and community computer training center; and developed radio programming for airing on local FM radio.

TNN’s educational and cultural objectives are to enhance public awareness of issues and events by disseminating news and ideas about our lives, our communities, and the broader world to our residents; and thus to offer the public an underpinning for individual thought and public discourse on the issues of our time.

The Advancement of TNN’s Mission by an LPFM Radio Station

The FM station will advance TNN’s educational objectives by enabling it to produce and distribute a spectrum of programs on culture, the economy, business, politics, and the broader world to its community of license; and thus to offer the public an underpinning for individual thought and public discourse on the issues of our time. TNN will air both locally produced non-entertainment programs and programs that are nationally distributed.
