**Multiple Ownership**

The attached Engineering Exhibit prepared by du Treil, Lundin & Rackley, Inc. demonstrates that the proposed acquisition of radio station WTIL(AM), Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, by International Broadcasting Corporation (IBC) is consistent with the multiple ownership rules of the Commission.

With respect to the acquisition of Station WTIL, the Exhibit illustrates that this station is in a defined radio market in which there are 29 radio stations, 15 AM and 14 FM stations, only two of which will be operated by ("IBC"), WTIL, and also WKVN, Quebradillas, Puerto Rico, which is the subject of a currently pending assignment application (File No. 20030530 DLA). Each station is located within the Grade A contour of UHF television station WVEO(TV), Ch. 44, Aguadilla, Puerto Rico, licensed to Southwestern Broadcasting Corporation, which is commonly owned by Pedro Roman Collazo, the owner of IBC. Station WVEO(TV) operates as a satellite television station with commonly owned television station WTCV(TV), Ch. 18, San Juan, Puerto Rico and is thus exempt under Note 5 to Section 73.3555 of the Rules from application of the multiple ownership rules. Additionally, the Exhibit lists at least 20 independently-owned radio stations in the radio market and, according to the Commission's records, at least four other television stations licensed to communities within the Grade A contour of WVEO(TV), including WOLE-TV, Ch. 12, Aguadilla-Mayaguez, WNJX-TV, Ch. 22, Mayaguez, WORA-TV, Ch. 5, Mayaguez-Aguadilla, and WJWN-TV, Ch. 38, San Sebastian. Thus, the acquisition of WTIL by IBC is fully consistent

with the local radio station multiple ownership rules which permit a party in a radio market of at least 29 stations to have an attributable ownership interest in up to six commercial radio stations, not more than four of which are in the same service in a radio market, and with the joint television/radio ownership rules, which would permit a party under the facts of this proposal to own at least one television's station and seven commercial radio stations.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>1</sup> IBC is also the licensee of WGIT(AM), Canovanos, Puerto Rico, which operates on 1660 KHz as an expanded band radio station. As such, WGIT(AM) is not included in this multiple ownership analysis under Note 9 to section 73.3555 of the Rules.
