COMMUNITY OF LICENSE

KTKK is applying to change the community of license from Sandy City to Kearns Township, both of which are located in Salt lake County, Utah.

Background. KTKK was forced to vacate their licensed site in 1997. Since that time the station has operated under Special Temporary Authority by diplexing in the tower of KLLB, West Jordan, Utah. As KLLB is higher in frequency, their antenna and ground system are substandard for 630 kHz, and South Jordan, where their tower is located, will not allow a height extension, and there is insufficient real estate at the tower location to extend the ground system to meet the requirements for 630 kHz. The ownership of KTKK has not been able to find a suitable site to relocate the KTKK array which can assure nighttime interference-free service to all of Sandy City,¹ and therefore seeks to change the community of license to a community which can receive nighttime interference-free service and is a community worthy of local aural service where there is at present no such local service.

Kearns is organized as a Township, which under Utah Law is “. . . a geographical area of community interest that increases local control and preserves local identity through the planning process. Each Township has its own planning commission consisting of seven members who are residents of the Township.” Kearns has a population of 33,659;² its own High School, its own Post Office, both Kearns and Sandy have their own library which are branches of the Salt Lake

¹ A technically suitable site was located within the limits of Bluffdale City, but the Bluffdale City Planning Commission changed the zoning designations while the KTKK application was under consideration to insure that the KTKK array could not be built. They wanted the land to be developed for residential use as that would create more tax revenue.

² Sandy population is 88,418.

County Library System. In addition to the public High School, there are in Kearns six elementary schools and a middle school. Kearns police services are contracted from the county sheriff, which many cities, towns and townships in Utah do. There are over 5 Banks and 2 Credit Unions, and 1031 businesses or organizations in Kearns. Both communities have their own community council and planning commission.

Stations providing city grade service to both communities:

1. AM Daytime: KNRS, KTKK [before and after change], KALL, KUTR, KKAT, KWDZ, KCPW*, KDYL, KSL, KJQS, KZNS, KFNZ, KSOP, KLLB, KMRI, KRRD, KBJA.
2. FM: KBYU-FM*, KUER-FM*, KRCL*, KUUU, KUBL-FM, KODJ, KHTB, KXRK, KZHT, KBZN, KBEE, KJMY, KSFI, KBER, KPQP, QQMB, KRSP, KSOP-FM, KXRV, KOSY-FM, KENZ.

AM stations not providing 5 mv/m and FM stations not providing 3.16 mv/m have not been included in the above list. Stations having a city-grade daytime contour over Kearns also have such service to Sandy, and conversely. Some additional FM stations (KCPW-FM* and KUFR*, for example) provide partial service to both communities. Some AM stations, such as KOVO and KSVN, provide partial service to both communities.

Moving KTKK will result in both Kearns and Sandy having locally licensed full-time aural service, rather than just one of the communities.
