Dear Mr. Kwon:

I am writing to inform you that the City of New York hereby grants you concurrence and has no objection to your flash cut application for K Licensee Ch17 Station WEBR conversion to digital broadcast operations conditionally upon the following.

- The digital conversion work must be completed within 90 days upon FCC approval in order to reduce existing interference as indicated in your letter dated May 5th 2009 being generated by your station (identified in our test report dated March 30th 2009).
- As part of the conversion we require that you install a filtering system which will reduce emissions from your digital transmitter such that its signal will not exceed -123 dBm in the channel 16 (482-488 MHz) Spectrum. The additional filtering provided must increase attenuation levels (as shown in the Myat 12 section band pass filter attenuation characteristics datasheet dated 5/20/09) beyond the "Full Service Digital Mask" as indicated in your Consultants report dated February 19, 2009.
- Upon completion of the new digital transmitter and filter installation a test will be required coordinated with representatives of the City of New York and your engineering staff present to validate that all interference to our Ch16 fixed receivers has been eliminated.
- Granting of this request does not waive the City of New York's rights to petition the FCC under Rule and Order 04-80 if interference continues to exist. Specifically that section 47 C.F.R. § 74.703(e) is still in force and that WEBR as a Class A Low power TV station is authorized on a secondary basis to existing Public Safety Land Mobile uses and must correct whatever interference they cause to land mobile stations or cease operations.

The City of New York members of NYMAC appreciate the commitment K Licensee has had in the past in working cooperatively with us and would like to continue along this path in resolving this problem.
