

COMMUNITY OF LICENSE CHANGE – SECTION 307(b) SHOWING

In accordance with the proposed change in the designated community of license of Station KCTC(AM) from Sacramento to West Sacramento, California, Entercom Sacramento License, LLC (“*Entercom*”) makes this showing to establish that the change in community of license is in the public interest under 47 U.S.C. §307(b) of the Communications Act and the implementing rules and regulations of the FCC. Pursuant to Section 307(b), the Commission will authorize the relocation of a facility to another community when doing so will “provide a fair, efficient and equitable distribution of radio service.” Relocating KCTC(AM) from Sacramento -- which is the city of license to seven licensed, full-power AM stations (including KCTC), 13 licensed, full-power FM stations, and six licensed, full-power television stations – to West Sacramento, which is the city of license to only a single, non-commercial AM station, KSMH -- will further such goals by providing the second local transmission service and the first local commercial service, to a growing, thriving community.

As proposed in the application, the predicted daytime service area of KCTC(AM) will not change, and the station will continue to serve the following areas and populations (Population Database: 2003 U.S. Census Estimate) with its .5 mV/m and 2.0 mV/m daytime service contours:

<u>Contour</u>	<u>Area (sq. Km)</u>	<u>Population</u>
.5 mV/m	38,847	4,208,378
2.0 mV/m	15,730	2,575, 290

The nighttime interference free service contour will serve a population of 370,645 persons according to the 2000 U.S. Census data, covering an area of 963 square kilometers.¹ Although this represents a loss of nighttime service compared to the current service, the result is compelled by FCC policies applicable to this site relocation and the existence of pending proposals which must be protected.

Sacramento is a well-served community with at least five full-time aural services providing it with protected service.² BIA lists more than 45 full-power AM and FM stations in the Sacramento Designated Market Area, which includes West Sacramento. KCTC(AM) will continue to provide the same protected daytime service to both West Sacramento and Sacramento. Therefore, relocating KCTC(AM) to West Sacramento will not deprive Sacramento

of abundant and ample protected reception service. The Section 307(b) analysis therefore falls within Priority (4), “other public interest matters.”³

West Sacramento has already been recognized by the Commission as a community worthy of its own local transmission service. KSMH(AM), a noncommercial educational AM station broadcasting a religious format, is currently licensed to West Sacramento. Located approximately five miles from Sacramento across the Sacramento River, West Sacramento was formally incorporated as a city in 1987. West Sacramento has its own strong, vibrant business, educational, residential, and social characteristics, and in 2005 had an estimated population in excess of 41,000, an increase of approximately 31% over the 2000 U.S. Census population of 30,450.⁴

Because the predicted service contours of KCTC will cover a majority of the Sacramento Urbanized Area, Entercom has included an analysis as described in *Faye & Richard Tuck, Inc. KBEC*, 3 FCC Rcd 5374, 5377 (1988) (“*Tuck*”) to demonstrate that West Sacramento is independent from the Sacramento Urbanized Area. Under *Tuck*, the Commission looks at eight separate factors to examine the interdependence between a community and a larger “urbanized area.” As shown in the following material, West Sacramento clearly qualifies as an independent community.

The *Tuck* factors are as follows:

- (1) The extent to which community residents work in the specified community, rather than the larger community. 2003 projected U.S. Census Bureau data indicates that approximately 17.6% of West Sacramento residents hold jobs in the private sector in West Sacramento.⁵ The West Sacramento projected employment for 2005 is in excess of 41,000,⁶ indicating that a substantial number of residents from other communities commute to West Sacramento for work, as well.
- (2) Whether the smaller community has its own newspaper or other media that covers the community's local needs and interests. A weekly newspaper, *The News-Ledger*, has been published in West Sacramento since 1964. It is published every Wednesday, and is available at newsstands and by mail. This publication “puts the spotlight on local [West Sacramento] people, politics, crime, business and development” and

describes itself as the “Official Newspaper of Record” for the City of West Sacramento.⁷

- (3) Whether community leaders and residents perceive the specified community as being an integral part of, or separate from, the larger metropolitan area. As indicated above, West Sacramento was formally incorporated as a city in 1987, and, as shown by the response to the following factor, has its own government and elected officials. Furthermore, the City of West Sacramento maintains its own Chamber of Commerce to represent businesses and industry in the city separate and distinct from neighboring cities. Additionally, the Rotary Club of West Sacramento Rotary Club has been in existence since 1949 serving the community of West Sacramento through community service projects focusing on youth and elderly.⁸
- (4) Whether the specified community has its own local government and elected officials. West Sacramento has a Council/Manager form of government. Citizens elect four City Council Members at large who serve four-year terms and directly elect the Mayor who serves a two-year term. The City currently holds elections on the first Tuesday of November in even numbered years.⁹
- (5) Whether the smaller community has its own telephone book provided by the local telephone company or zip code. West Sacramento has been assigned two unique zip codes: 95605 and 95691. The U.S. Post Office maintains at least five branch offices within West Sacramento.¹⁰
- (6) Whether the community has its own commercial establishments, health facilities, and transportation systems. According to an International Economic Development Council report prepared in 2004, there are 25 major employers located in West Sacramento, each employing from 55 to 2,077 people. These employers include government agencies, such as the U.S. Post Office, the State of California and the Washington Unified School District, and the headquarters of a number of private companies, including Raley’s/Bel Air grocery stores, NOR-Cal Beverage, Rex Moore Electrical, MTS (Tower Records), and Tony’s Fine Foods. In 2003, at least nine new businesses relocated to the West Sacramento area. The

West Sacramento Chamber of Commerce is the leading business organization in the city representing local businesses in the West Sacramento area.¹¹

- (7) The extent to which the specified community and the central city are part of the same advertising market. Although there is substantial coverage of West Sacramento by Sacramento-based media, the successful existence of the local weekly newspaper, the News-Ledger, for over 40 years is indicative of a local demand for advertising as well.
- (8) The extent to which the specified community relies on the larger metropolitan area for various municipal services. Nine public schools and several private schools serve West Sacramento. The city recently approved a \$25 million local school bond issue and a special commission on school excellence. Higher education is within easy reach with four community colleges located nearby, including the West Sacramento Center of Sacramento City College.¹²

The City of West Sacramento provides comprehensive utility and municipal services to its residents. The city maintains its own police and fire departments and provides building permitting, land use and real estate development services. The West Sacramento Police Department is staffed with 73 sworn officers and 38 civilian full-time employees. Other positions include part-time police officers, parking enforcement officers, reserve police officers and volunteers. Additionally, a Domestic Violence Advocate and Probation Officer are housed at the Police Department to enhance the services provided by the Department. The West Sacramento Fire Department is located in four fire stations throughout the City, each of which houses one front line fire engine equipped to handle a variety of emergency calls. The four fire stations operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with a combined staffing of 15 personnel on duty.¹³

Additionally, the City of West Sacramento provides water and sewage services to its residents with the Bryte Bend water treatment plant located within West Sacramento. This treatment plant diverts water from the Sacramento River and provides treatment at the recently upgraded and expanded, state-of-the-art facility, which was designed to serve the city's expanding needs. In addition to the plant, the city operates several water

tanks to provide additional storage for fire and emergency needs.¹⁴ Sewage services are provided by the City of West Sacramento Wastewater Treatment Plant, first built in 1948. The plant has gone through two expansions; one in 1977 and one in 1988 along with one major improvement project during the early 1990's. A new waste treatment plant is scheduled to be built in 2007.¹⁵

Under Section 307(b), the conclusion that West Sacramento is deserving of its second local transmission service and first local commercial service is clear. By assigning KCTC(AM) to West Sacramento, a fair, efficient, and equitable distribution of radio service will be achieved. For the foregoing reasons, Entercom Sacramento License, LLC respectfully submits that the proposed change in community of license will produce a fair, efficient, and equitable distribution of radio service and that this application should therefore be granted.


Though a relatively young city, West Sacramento community life dates back to the Gold Rush. Businesses will easily find health care, education and other retail and business services in and around West Sacramento. Urgent care and medical offices are located in the city and a full service hospital is located a few miles from the city center. Nine public schools and several private schools serve West Sacramento. The city's commitment to quality schools is evidenced by approval of a \$25 million local school bond issue and a special commission on school excellence. Higher education is also within easy reach with four community colleges located nearby, including the West Sacramento Center of Sacramento City College. Five universities and numerous private colleges offer specialized degree and occupational training programs.



Whether your interests include baseball, boating or bicycling, West Sacramento can accommodate you. Our 22 neighborhood parks include direct river access for fishing and boating, viewing the river or enjoying concerts at River Walk Park. During summer evenings, you're likely to find residents at Raley Field enjoying a River Cats game. West Sacramento is at the heart of a thriving metropolitan area whose cultural offerings include the Sacramento Ballet, Opera and Philharmonic, the Sacramento Community Theater and art and history museums. Other leisure and entertainment opportunities include fine restaurants, wineries, brew pubs and the popular Sacramento Kings NBA basketball team.

REGIONAL CULTURE AND RECREATION

West Sacramento is in the heart of the thriving Sacramento metropolitan area, known for its rich cultural offerings and proximity to world class, year-round recreation. The Sacramento Ballet, Opera and Philharmonic, the Sacramento Community Theater, the annual Music Circus and multiple theatre groups provide many opportunities to enjoy regional and international entertainment. The annual Sacramento Dixieland Jazz Jubilee music festival takes place on the Sacramento and West Sacramento waterfronts with local and international musicians entertaining throughout the Memorial Holiday weekend. Nearby, UC Davis recently added a 104,000-square foot performing arts center. The Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts offers a wide variety of programs and music from around the world including a lecture series featuring authors, politicians and scientists, adding to the region's increasing international recognition.



The Sacramento and American Rivers meet and define West Sacramento's northern and eastern boundaries, providing easy access to hiking, camping, boating, water skiing and fishing. The American River Parkway offers one of the finest riparian recreational corridors of any metropolitan area in the United States. Each weekend, thousands of Sacramentans bike along its shores, fly fish for salmon from its banks and wade and bathe on its pristine beaches and sandbars.

A few minutes across the Tower Bridge in downtown Sacramento are the retail shops and restaurants of the downtown area and historic Old Sacramento. Downtown attractions include the Crocker Art Museum, the State Railroad Museum, the Tower Antique Auto Museum, Sacramento Community Theatre, IMAX Theater and numerous nightclubs and restaurants.

Sacramentans are enthusiastic sports fans and support professional teams including the beloved NBA Kings, the women's NBA Sacramento Monarchs, the Sacramento Knights professional soccer team, and West Sacramento's own River Cats, Triple A baseball affiliate of the Oakland Athletics. Residents regularly make the short drive to see the Oakland Raiders, San Francisco 49ers and Giants.

Just a two-hour drive from ski resorts in the Sierra Nevada Mountains and state parks on the scenic Northern California coast, Sacramento's location is ideal. The Napa Sonoma wine country is a leisurely one and a half hour's drive away, as are the cosmopolitan charms of San Francisco Bay.

PARKS AND RECREATION

West Sacramento's outstanding recreational opportunities include 11 miles of river frontage, 17 parks, 2 pools, 3 community centers, and a wide selection of recreational programs for every interest. River Walk Park, the crown jewel of the city, offers scenic access to the Sacramento River and plays host to many community concerts and activities the West Sacramento Chamber of Commerce sponsors the annual River Bank Music Festival and Neighbors Fair every fall featuring nationally recognized blues, rock and gospel talents as well as local musicians. A full day of live entertainment, arts and crafts, kids activities, and a variety of delicious ethnic foods, make this event a regional favorite. Also sponsored by the City of West Sacramento is the free evening concert series "Harmony on the River" held at the River Walk Park. Additionally, the Civic Center Concert Series features the West Sacramento Orchestra in free concerts held at the new Civic Center.

Local bicycle clubs frequently meet on the city's bicycle trails to travel to Sacramento recreational areas and nearby city of Davis trails. The West Sacramento Bicycle Path Gateway is a bicycle park at the end of West Capitol Avenue where cyclists can rest before crossing the Yolo Bypass. Additional bike paths are being added as the Southport development continues to grow and expand.

The City of West Sacramento places special emphasis on the development of children by offering a wide spectrum of activities and programs. Youth sports programs include Little League Baseball, girl's softball, swimming, boy's and girl's basketball, street hockey, soccer, rowing and NFL flag football. The "After-School Adventure" is a fun, educational and athletic program that kids can participate in throughout the school year for free. During the summer months, children can participate in a six-week day camp held at several locations in the city. Eleven different youth sports special events are held annually by the Recreation Department. The Club West Teen Center also offers after school programs and annually host field trips, dances, and club activities. The West Sacramento branch of the Yolo County Library is open six days a week and offers preschool story time, school age crafts and stories, and teen poetry contests.

EDUCATION

Primary Education

There are eight public elementary schools, one middle school and two high schools in the Washington Unified School District. The newest addition to the district, Bridgeway Elementary School opened in 2002 and is located in the Bridgeway Island community of Southport. West Sacramento's dedication to improve the educational environment for all children was reaffirmed with the passage of a \$52 million school bond in March 2004 to build a new high school. The new school site will be in the Southport area in anticipation of the expected population growth. Local school scores continue to rise each year in the Washington School District with River City High School scoring the largest improvement in the Sacramento and Placer County

areas for 2003. In 2002, both Southport Elementary and Westmore Oaks Elementary received the California Distinguished Schools Award. And in 2003, Westmore Oaks Elementary School was the only recipient of the national No Child Left Behind Blue Ribbon Award in Yolo County. Elementary school teacher Dawn Imamoto was named Teacher of the Year for 2004, celebrating her unwavering dedication to education. Vocational Education

There are six accredited vocational schools located in West Sacramento, including the newest addition Wyo-Tech. Specializing in car technology and repair, the 80,000 square foot campus is part of Corinthian Colleges which was ranked No. 6 on Fortune magazine's 2003 list of the 100 fastest-growing companies. West Sacramento's River City High School offers a School at Work program targeting electronics and engineering training. Students are offered workplace training with local firms while attending school. The Linking Education to Economic Development (LEED) program is a regional program used by many businesses in the area including the River Cats and also by River City High School to link university courses and training to local companies needs. They offer the Workforce Skills Certification program, certifying participants as skilled in a variety of areas, and the California Intern Connection a program that matches participating businesses with interns.

Secondary Education

Community Life

Located within 20 minutes of West Sacramento are five universities and four public community colleges. UC Davis is one of the top rated public universities in the nation with the medical center ranking highly among America's Best Hospitals in 2003 according to a recent U.S. News & World Report. The University's Medical school was ranked in the top 40 in the nation, as well as the professional schools of Law, Business, and Engineering, according to a separate report by U.S. News & World Report.

California State University, Sacramento is also nearby and has been recognized as one of the top public universities in the country by U.S. News & World Report. This beautiful campus is located adjacent to the American River and offers a wide variety of academic programs.

The Los Rios Community College District has four campuses in the metropolitan region. Services available to businesses through the Community College system include the International Trade Development program which offers no and low-cost consulting services as well as seminars and workshops. The Workplace Learning program offers employers high quality, affordable services for improved employee performance. And the Small Business Development and Consulting program offers in depth help to those who already own a small business and those that want to start a small business. Los Rios Community Colleges offer many different degrees and certifications including: accounting, biotechnology, business, management, nursing, technical communications, web page design, and computer programming.

RETAIL SERVICES

Retail and commercial services are located in five local shopping centers throughout West Sacramento. The central business district, centered at the intersection of Jefferson Boulevard and West Capitol Avenue, is home to three national bank branches, many restaurants, several grocery stores, two national drug store chains and numerous retail services. The rapidly growing Southport area will soon have a its own neighborhood shopping center called the Southport Town Center. The West Sacramento Police Department is committed to providing quality service to the community and its guests through maintaining order, fostering a sense of security, enforcing the laws of the City and State, and supporting the Constitution of the United States and the State of California.

The Police Department provides a full range of police services to the residents of West Sacramento - 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Our department is responsible for patrolling city neighborhoods, responding to calls for service, investigating crime and arresting offenders and working closely with the community to identify and solve problems of crime and neighborhood disorder. We also provide educational programs to assist our citizens with making their homes and surrounding areas a safe and enjoyable place to live.



The Department is organizationally divided into three Offices. These Offices include: Administration, Investigations/Support Services, which includes the Code Enforcement Division, and Operations. Our police officers service a population of 40,000 and patrol 23.3 square miles.

The Department is staffed with 73 sworn officers and 38 civilian full-time employees. Other positions include part-time police officers, parking enforcement officers, reserve police officers and volunteers. Additionally, a Domestic Violence Advocate and Probation Officer are housed at the Police Department to enhance the services provided by the Department.

Frequently Asked Question

- Have Public Safety Services kept pace with the growth and development in the City?

Answer: Yes

The true measure of the adequacy of growth in public safety services is not directly related to the growth in population. There are more accurate ways to assess the level of services.

When the city incorporated in 1987 the population was 28,000. By the year 2005 the population had grown to 40,000, which is an increase of approximately 43%. By comparison the staffing level of the Police Department has increased from 75 in 1987 to 111 today, which is an increase of 33%.

While the percentages do not match, they should not necessarily do so. More accurate measures are response time to serious or violent crimes and the percentage of time that officers have for preventative or suppression activities. A recent sampling of higher priority calls showed a response time of five minutes, which is within norms. The percentage of time for prevention and suppression activities is still being calculated.

Beginning in 2005 the city adopted a three year plan that will increase public safety staffing in each of those years. Beyond that, as revenues continue to grow the city will plan for increased demand for services in future years.

West Sacramento continues to be a safe place to live, work and raise a family.



The West Sacramento Fire Department has the mission of protecting life, environment, and property within the City of West Sacramento. To effectively complete this mission, the Department has located four fire stations throughout the City, each of which houses one front line fire engine equipped to handle a variety of emergency calls. The four fire stations operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with a combined staffing of 15 personnel on duty. Firefighters work 24-hour tours of duty. There are three work groups called "shifts". Additionally, an off duty Division Chief is assigned as Duty Chief to respond to all structure fires and other major emergencies to provide Incident Command and Scene Management.



The City is currently upgrading and modifying its sewage pump stations and plans to decommission its wastewater treatment plant in late 2007 when the system is connected to the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District (SRCSD) regional plant. The city will continue to operate the sewer collection and pumping system with a total of 13 sewer lift stations pumping wastewater to the regional plant, via the Lower Northwest Interceptor Line.
