On March 14, 2003, the FCC approved the acquisition of, *inter alia*, KWBP(TV), Portland, Oregon and KWBP-LP, Reedville, Oregon, by Tribune Denver Radio, Inc. ("Tribune Denver"). See FCC File Nos. BALCT-20030113ACJ-ACM, granted March 14, 2003. Consummation of this transaction occurred on March 21, 2003, and the requisite notice was filed with the FCC on March 26, 2003.

Prior to Tribune Denver's acquisition of KWBP(TV) and KWBP-LP, the prior licensee, Acme Television of Oregon, LLC ("Acme"), operated the KWBP-LP facility pursuant to an STA that was originally granted in January of 2000, see FCC File No. BSTA-19991213AAK, and then subsequently renewed by a series of extension requests:

Acme continued to operate KWBP-LP pursuant to renewed STAs despite the fact that the FCC approved a construction permit for the STA facilities in July 2001. See FCC Permit No. BPTVL-20010626ABD. Although Acme's last STA extension expired on January 22, 2003, Acme (and now Tribune Denver) have continued to operate KWBP-LP as specified in the STA as well as the construction permit.

Upon its acquisition of the main station and its LPTV facilities, Tribune Denver discovered the inadvertent lapse in STA authority and determined that the underlying construction permit covered the same facilities that were specified in the original STA that had been repeatedly renewed. Upon reviewing the facts, Tribune Denver determined that the instant license application was the most appropriate step to take from a regulatory perspective to bring the current KWBP-LP operation into compliance.
