MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Milwaukee Area Technical College ("MATC"), by its attorneys, hereby requests an extension of time to and including August 9, 2001 in which to respond to the Motion for Leave to Supplement the Record and Supplement to Oppositions to Petitions for Reconsideration relating to the above-referenced application. Counsel for KM LPTV of Milwaukee, L.L. P. ("KM") has been advised of this request for extension of time.¹

Ordinarily, MATC's response would have been due today, July 25, 2001. However, MATC's counsel has been consumed by the FCC's July 19, 2001 point system deadline for noncommercial educational mutually exclusive applications. Thus, undersigned counsel has not had adequate time to confer with MATC or its consulting engineer regarding a response. Moreover, undersigned counsel is scheduled to be out of the office from July 27, 2001 until August 5, 2001 due to a family medical issue. For these reasons, MATC requests additional time, so that it may consult with counsel and with its engineer regarding a response.


¹ MATC has complied with the notice provisions of Section 1.46(c) of the FCC rules.

MATC submits that this brief extension of time will allow the Commission to have a more complete record upon which to decide this proceeding. No party will be prejudiced by this short extension and KM has indicated that it would not object to MATC filing responsive pleading on the issues raised in KM's Motion and Supplement. Moreover, because KM's Supplement is not a part of a regular pleading cycle (and therefore not authorized by the FCC's rules unless the FCC staff decides to grant KM's Motion), MATC's response should not be due until after the FCC determines that KM's Supplement should be considered.

For these reasons, MATC requests an additional period of approximately two weeks, until Thursday, August 9, 2001, to file its response.
