They discussed what goes into making a newscast, how editorial decisions are made and did mock interviews with the attendees. Feb. 10, 2018: KTVO's Jacqueline Schutte emceed the 2018 Polar Plunge in Kirksville, Missouri. The event raised more than \$13,304 for Special Olympics and its athletes.
