Liberty's Kids II was preempted on 3/30/13 and not scheduled to a designated second home because its normal second home was not available due to sports. Preempted episodes of Teen Kids News were not rescheduled to a designated second home because this show is rarely affected by sports programming and does not have a second home. In January, February, and March 2013, KTVL News10 presented Cool Schools, a news series which profiled 14 public elementary schools in Northern California.
