The boys attend a local public middle school. One of the twins is polite and shy and excels in academics, while the other, athletic and extroverted, barely scrapes by in school, due to lack of effort. The disruption was caused when a piece of equipment failed that is used to provide signal synchronization and stereo audio for distribution to ABC affiliates. The equipment has been replaced and a diligent investigation is underway to determine the cause of the failure. Although not required to do so, WBRZ aired the entire interrupted episode on the following Saturday June 4th from 11-11:30 am. Notification of this makegood episode was done via crawl in the regularly scheduled Hannah Montana on June 4th at 10am. 2) As noted in the report above, children's programming aired 1 hour later then regularly scheduled on Sunday June 12th due to human error. WBRZ takes the responsibility of airing Children's Programming in accordance with rules of the Federal communications Commission very seriously and disciplines any infractions accordingly. 3) WBRZ is dedicated to nurturing the educational and informational needs of our younger viewing audience.
