The main character, Sheldon, is an orphaned yokai shell mollusk adopted by the Clam family and living with them in the family-owned Charming Clan Inn. Dr. Shell, an elder and venerated inventor, and Connie, a cowry shell classmate of Sheldon's also lives at the inn. Sheldon and his buddies Herman (a hermit crab) and Connie always work together and solve problems that they face in school or in the community. A recurring problem is to staunch the plans of the local millionaire, Cecil Cracken, whose greed puts making money over protecting the environment. Dr. Shell is typically the children's key provider of knowledge and other resources. In each episode, the children learn a significant social-emotional lesson and also share information relating to their ocean habitat and environmental protection. |
