On September 20, 2017, WTIN-TV went silent as a result of damage caused by Hurricane Maria. Since that time, except for a brief interruption in the aftermath of the storm, the WAPA-TV and WAPA 4.2 programming, including the programming identified in this report, has aired on the multicast channels of other stations in the market.
