"Ultimate Choice Florida" and Ultimate Choice Real Girls" provides an opportunity for its young viewers to learn more about themselves and their lives, as well as to develop their own convictions about each of the moral issues explored and discussed on this television series. In "Ultimate Choice Florida" each episode presents the teens with a heart stopping extreme adventure along with an opportunity to discuss that experience and its application to major real life issues. "Ultimate Choice Real Girls" finds five diverse young women who are invited to join a revolution . . . a revolution to live a dramatically different life than that dictated by the pop culture.
